Scripture Reflection

The prophet Daniel, in the First Reading, describes one like the Son of Man (the title that Christ used for himself). God gives dominion and glory to him, so that all may serve him. This is a Kingdom that is both universal and eternal.

From the Gospel, we learn that Jesus' Kingdom "does not belong to this world." It is not a civil or military rule as some expected the Messiah's reign to be. It is not bound by geography or history, but is beyond time and space. The reign of God exists in human hearts and calls for human allegiance to God and God's commandments of love, justice, and hope. It belongs to the heavenly arena, where God's life and love are experienced fully. However, the Kingdom can, in its incipient form, be experienced in this present life. Whenever we experience goodness and love. God is present and therefore so is his Kingdom, at least in miniature. The Kingdom is both present and yet to come in its fullness, when all will belong to God completely.

Pilate asked the Teacher, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered: "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here." It is a true answer, of course, but also elusive, for though Jesus' kingdom is "not from this world" and does not involve peace treaties, concordats, armies and diplomatic corps, it includes all of this world and all that is in it.

Pilate asked Jesus if he was a king and Jesus replied, "You say I am a king." Jesus is careful with his response, and then clarifies what he means. He is not the kind of king that Pilate is asking about. He has no intention of challenging the Roman rulers. However, his rule is authentic, leading those who hear him to the truth of God.

• Christ is the universal ruler over nations and peoples. Does the feast of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, help you make sense of the Church's role in the world?

Updates on Events in Parish

- (1) Needed patching has been done between the Cathedral and rectory. Thank you to parishioner, Jason Strohm, who coordinated this project with New Enterprise and Limestone.
- (2) Cleaning up of our properties between Fourteenth Avenue and the parking lot continues, Thank you to Jean Koury, the Chip and Sheri Gray Family, and John Fischer who have worked to clean up the properties of brush, wood, and leaves. This is being done at the insistence of the City of Altoona. There is more work to be done. If interested please call Parish Office to make arrangements.
- (3) The Crypt Chapel below the main altar in the Cathedral continues its renovation. New lighting and drop ceiling have been installed, thank you to Tim Bettwy. A green marble backing has been placed to hold the beautiful marble crucifix from the chapel of the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth of the former Mercy Hospital. And new arches have been created within the chapel. The Parish is grateful to the generosity of an anonymous donor from the parish.
- (4) The project for the 2015 Annual Catholic Appeal, the replacement of heating units and a section of new steps on the front of the Cathedral (alley side), will be undertaken in the spring of 2016.
- (5) The razing of the former school building and former convent building is scheduled within the next weeks. We have been penalized by the City's Codes Office for the delay with this project. The delay was due to the contracted company removing the asbestos weeks later than originally scheduled.


Rite of Welcoming and Acceptance

SACRAMENT PREPARATION CONFIRMATION

During this past liturgical year the General Instruction of the Roman Missal was reviewed. Particular aspects of the Mass were discussed as presented by the Church. The use of bells, the number of candles, the processional cross, decorations around the altar, images of saints, placement of tabernacle, seasonal practices, genuflections and bows, and various liturgical ministries were presented within the context of the mystery of faith. The Church gathers to celebrate the paschal supper instituted by Christ as the Sacrifice of his Body and Blood. The General Instruction is an aid to assist the universal Church at liturgy in giving praise and thanks to our God through our Lord Jesus in the Holy Spirit.
