# Scripture Reflection

Today's First Reading is from a section of the Book of Jeremiah, the prophet, referred to as the book of consolation (30:1--31:40). It offers a hopeful view of the future, when God will rescue Israel. God, like a loving parent, will gather and guide Israel. Among the returning people are the blind and lame, the poor, the humble, those without status or power who depend upon God as their sole source of hope and help. These people are traditionally referred to in the Old Testament as the *anawim*.

Mark's Gospel account tells us about one of the *anawim*, Bartimaeus, a blind man. Bartimaeus calls out to Jesus, in spite of the disciples' efforts to silence him. The response of the disciples is to scold and rebuke. People told him, basically, to shut up. To Bartimaeus' credit, he would not listen. Bartimaeus has something these followers of Jesus lack: the understanding that even if he is physically (and spiritually?) blind, he knows where to go for the cure. He has faith in the mercy of Jesus and he will not be put off by disciples shooing him away as a nuisance.

Jesus knows exactly what he wants, but he wants Bartimaeus to say it again, for the sake of the disciples and the crowd, some of whom moments ago were telling him to be quiet, shut up, leave the great man alone. Bartimaeus simply asks "My teacher, let me see again." Jesus response is just as direct, "Go, your faith has made you well." Bartimaeus' faith leads to Jesus' mercy, but Jesus' mercy leads to spiritual discipleship, not just physical sight, as Bartimaeus does not "go" but "followed him on the way."

Bartimaeus' discipleship is the result of Jesus' mercy and the reason why mercy must be at the heart of the church's mission. Who do we tell today to shut up, to quit bothering the Messiah? Bartimaeus at the side of the road is an example for all those at the margins of the church calling out to be heard: Do not give up on Jesus; he will listen and heal those who call out to him. Picture yourself as Bartimaeus at the side of the road calling out to Jesus. What mercy do you want Jesus to do for you? What mercy are you being called upon to show others? How can we live out Jesus' mercy more completely?

The Most Blessed Sacrament should be reserved in a tabernacle in a part of the church that is truly noble, prominent, conspicuous, worthily decorated, and suitable for prayer. There should be only one tabernacle, be irremovable, be made of solid and inviolable material that is not transparent, and be locked in such a way that profanation is prevented. The tabernacle is never placed on the altar on which Mass is celebrated. The Diocesan Bishop directs the placement of the tabernacle either in the sanctuary, apart from the altar of celebration, or in some chapel suitable for private adoration and organically connected to the church and readily noticeable by
