# Scripture Reflection

In the Gospel, the Pharisees, trying to trick Jesus, ask him to comment on divorce. Jesus reminds them of the original order of creation: God joins a man and a woman (a couple) and humans should not divide them. Both the Genesis story and the Gospel emphasize the need for relationship and community, marriage and faithfulness, so that humans are not isolated. It is God's plan to have this close connection among humans.

Children are brought to Jesus, so that he might touch them and they might come to know him. However, the disciples, apparently thinking these meetings are a waste of Jesus's time, try to prevent the encounters. Frequently in Mark, the disciples play the role of gatekeepers, trying to prevent the crowds from bothering Jesus. But their efforts create a barrier, and Jesus is indignant. The lesson is: Don't hinder anyone from experiencing Christ: don't put obstacles on the path of faith; don't think that a person must fit a certain criteria before Jesus is interested. Christ wishes to welcome everyone. Jesus tells the disciples that "to such as these belongs the kingdom of God." In fact, the Reign of God belongs to those who, like these children, are eager to be with Christ, trusting and open to his words.

In the Genesis creation story, everything was called good until God said "It is not good for the man to be alone." This section of Genesis teaches us that human beings are made for one another and that no other creature or thing can replace the human relationships that help us grow in holiness. God created a partner for Adam. Take time this week to make a list of the people with whom God has enriched your life.

 Adults, children, spouses, parents, siblings, and friends---we all need each other. Thank God for the human gifts in your life. Let him or her know of your love and appreciation.

# Liturgical Reflection ...

General Instruction

of the

Roman Missal

Moderation should be observed in the decoration of the altar. Flowers in Advent are marked with moderation in anticipation of Christmas; floral arrangements for the altar are forbidden in Lent in anticipation of Easter. Flowers and plants are always to be around the altar rather than on the altar table. During the Liturgy of the Word the Book of the Gospels may be placed on the altar; for the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the chalice, paten, ciborium, corporal and purificator along with the Roman Missal are placed on the altar. Arranged discreetly, there should be a microphone to amplify the priest's voice.
