Scripture Reflection

Joshua poses a challenge to the tribes of Israel that remains relevant for each of us: decide today whom you will serve. Is it time to take stock of where you place your faithfulness? Make a list of the people and things in your life that are most important to you. Be as honest as you can. You might look over last month's credit card spending, calendar, and phone texts to get a true sense of where and with whom you spend the most time, money, and energy. Who and what comes first? Where is God on the list? Can you honestly say, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord"?

Jesus realizes that he puts difficult choices before his followers. Some might even be shocked at his suggestion that they eat and drink of his Body and Blood. When Jesus tells his disciples that they will eat his flesh and drink his blood, they respond. "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" It is only by being subject and open to the Spirit that we are able to grasp Jesus' teaching, that it brings us to life. Openness to another, even when understanding is missing, brings about unity. The disciples need to make a decision. Will they remain with the current limited world of flesh, or will they believe and accept his words of Spirit and life: some return to their old ways, but the Twelve remain.

When the disciples were asked if they too wished to go away, Peter speaks for us. "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." The choice needs to be made again and again over the course of a lifetime. When everything is going well and life is full of successes, the choice is a nobrainer. When life has thrown us some curve balls and tragedy, sickness, and death strikes, the choice must be made. Do we remain with the Lord or do we leave? As for me and my house, we shall stay and serve the Lord. Really, where else would we go?

 Would you identify yourself as a faithful follower of the Lord? Have you ever blamed God; so angry, you would not talk to him? Have you ever thanked God in the midst of pain and hurt?

CATHOLIC EDUCATION

Catholic schools provide a nurturing and caring environment for our children where Jesus Christ is the center of daily life. The greater Altoona area has a plan for the future of Catholic education in our community. The decision has been made to regionalize our Catholic schools. For the 2016-2017 school vear there will be one school with three sites. Two elementary sites will be to the north and south (housing pre-K through fifth grade) with one middle school (housing sixth through eighth grade) in between the two elementary sites. The name of the school along with the names of the three sites will be chosen by a committee made up of parents, teachers and administrators.

The regionalization plan is the result of decreasing enrollment and increasing costs which will directly address utilizing our best resources, improving curriculum, keeping tuition at a reasonable rate, and ensuring our elementary students consistency in exceptional high school readiness upon graduation. Regionalization will help local families choose a Catholic school that offers the highest quality education in a safe environment for learning and personal development. Hallmarks of a Catholic school are challenging academics, a developed discipline, competing athletics, value laden activities, and always, Jesus Christ at the center of school life.

Catholic education in the greater Altoona area is provided pre-K through 12. With the new plan, there will be two elementary sites (pre-K through grade five), one middle school (grades six through eight), and Bishop Guilfoyle Catholic High School (grades nine through twelve). We believe that Catholic education makes a difference. Cathedral Parish has been committed to the availability of a quality Catholic education since our founding in 1851, and we stand by this commitment for future generations of children in our community.
