Scripture Reflection

There is a saying attributed to St. Francis of Assisi: "Preach the Gospel always; when necessary use words." James challenges us to "be doers of the word and not hearers only", and the Gospel instructs us to honor God with both our hearts and our lips. The message seems clear: live our faith with integrity in such a way that what is true in our hearts shows through in all our words and actions.

The Book of Deuteronomy is focused on the Torah, proclaimed at Sinai, that exhorts the people to observe all that God has commanded. Israel is reminded that to hear means to faithfully observe the one true God's commands. James continues the message to become doers of the Word not just hearers. He gives an example: take care of the widows and orphans. These groups are meant to include all who are defenseless and need God's people to care for them. The reading from Mark's Gospel describes the Pharisaic traditions that had added obligations to the Law (such as hand washing). God is not honored by following traditions alone but from having a heart that listens to God's voice and obeys. God wishes to receive sincere, whole-hearted response rather than lip service. Jesus states that defilement, separation from God, does not come from non-observance of traditions (from what we eat or how we eat it) but from evil within our own hearts.

Jesus' theme is to convert our own hearts in order to follow God's law. Jesus warns us against our hearts being turned against God and our fellow humans. For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come. The starting point regarding excising sin is always a searching, personal moral inventory, since whenever we sin it is because we have given ourselves permission, in however subtle a way, to do what we desire. Once free of evil, then the Christian is free to serve God in a life full of service to others.

• The closer I get to God should equal the closer I am to my brothers and sisters in need. If I am faithful and constant in prayer, then I am busy <u>doing</u> all that the Lord asks of me.

Diocese Announces Altoona School Regionalization

At the conclusion of the 2015-2016 academic vear. Altoona Central Catholic School. Saint Rose of Lima School, Saint John the Evangelist School all in Altoona, Hollidaysburg Catholic School, and Saint Patrick School in Newry will close as parish schools. Effective in the 2016-2017 academic year, one regional school will open with two campuses for students in pre-kindergarten through grade five. One campus will be at the current site of Altoona Central Catholic School and the other will be at the current site of Hollidaysburg Catholic School. Both locations will offer the same curriculum. A third campus the current site of Saint Rose of Lima School will house a middle school for students in grades six, seven, and eight. The curriculum will be based on the STREAM model (Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Arts, and Math) and will include numerous partnerships with local universities and businesses. Through those collaborations, students will engage in hands-on educational opportunities designed to create a more seamless transition into high school.

The Interim Board selected the three campus sites based on the capacity and potential of each facility, as well as the geographic locations related to our student populations. A committee made up of parents, teachers and administrators will have the opportunity to name the new regional school and campuses.

Altar Servers assist the priest at Mass. Servers care for the candles before and after Mass. They carry the cross and candles in the opening and closing processions. A server holds the Roman Missal for the priest celebrant when not at the altar. Severs help with the bread, wine, and water during the preparation of the gifts. The servers provide water and towel for the washing of the priest's hands. Where it is the custom the server rings the bell at the appropriate time. Altar servers participate at Mass. responding to the prayers and dialogues, and joining in the singing of the songs and acclamations. Faith communities determine the appropriate age for altar servers; the Diocese directs that they have received the Sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist.
