Scripture Reflection

As infants, prior to the coming of speech, we communicate with sounds, gestures and facial expressions. Long before we can speak to our mothers, fathers or older siblings, we fall in love with them. It is a tactile love, based upon the senses of touch, hearing, smelling, tasting and seeing. What if this is how we fall in love with God?

These sorts of tactile images abound in Scripture, in which the physical senses are used to describe our relationship with God. Theologians refer to these descriptions as "spiritual senses". Spiritual senses are not always used in the Bible as a metaphor, they arque, but analogically as a way to describe how we discern the presence of God, actual spiritual senses by which we communicate and enter into relationship with God. The connection between the physical senses and the spiritual senses is always present, for the physical senses are the means by which we become sensitive to spiritual realities and grounded in the reality of God's presence

In response to the crowd's request for something like the miraculous feeding that their ancestors experienced with Moses in the wilderness, Jesus responds that he brings something better: he himself is bread from heaven, and receiving him as sent by the Father will give them more than the satisfaction of physical hunger; it will give the eternal life that their hearts desire. And so we touch, taste, hear, smell and see God who is bread for life. We move from the physical to the spiritual level. All who come to him, not only Israel, shall be taught by God. As he says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

PARISH ACQUIRES BUILDING

The former National Cash Register building and, most recently, the former Kopp Drug Office building at 1405 Thirteenth Avenue is now the property of the Cathedral Parish. The purchase of this three story building was formally contracted on July 31, 2015. This transaction follows the strong recommendation of the Finance and Parish Pastoral Councils.

The third floor of the building (entrance on Thirteenth Avenue) will become Parish Offices. The second floor (entrance on Fourteenth Street, across from the rectory) will become Religious Education classrooms. The ground floor (entrance by alley) will become a future space for parish activities and meetings.

The main reason for this project is needed space for Religious Education. The Parish feels blessed to have this property in our possession. We will need to create appropriate space for the various needs of the parish. Funds will need to be raised to make the proper adjustments to this former warehouse.

The music ministry of Cantor and Choir exercise their own liturgical function. When properly carried out, the cantor and choir foster the active participation of the faithful by means of the singing. It is fitting that the cantor and choir director guide and support the people's singing. Especially when there is no choir, the cantor has the responsibility to direct the different pieces of music, with the people taking the part proper to them. The cantor needs to practice regularly in preparation for Mass. Roman Missal Tone quality, diction, projection, and a confidence with the musical selections are necessary for this ministry.
