Scripture Reflection

The pairing of the story of Elisha feeding a hundred people from twenty barley loaves with John's account of Jesus sharing five barley loaves and two fish with five thousand men surely prompts us to reflect on the similarities and differences. The similarities - miraculous sharing of barley loaves, abundance of leftovers - show Jesus to be in the tradition of Israelite prophets addressing physical hunger, but the differences - Jesus feeds more people starting with less bread - show Jesus to be a much greater prophet. Both the prophet Elisha and Jesus understand the essential human need to eat. Both feed large, hungry crowds. All were fed and no one was left hungry.

There is no question that Jesus' actions and the stories that recount them, found in all four Gospels, are modeled on the account of Elisha feeding a hungry crowd. There is also no question that in both stories there is a spiritual meaning that runs deeper than the simple physical act of nourishing the body. Elisha gives the people the food dedicated to God as the first fruits; Jesus will offer himself as the spiritual bread from heaven. But the spiritual truth does not negate the meaning of the material bread and the necessary sustenance it offers.

It is the act of giving what is needed physically that allows people to see with the eyes of the soul, to look beyond this world to the world eternal, from the barley bread to the bread of heaven. God's abundance, poured out over the whole earth, is intended for everyone. All are called to participate in this richness, to be a part of the one body and one Spirit, sharing in the material and the spiritual bread. If our economics do not make room for feeding everyone, with some left over, it is not because the church's science is faulty but because of our hardened hearts. There is enough for everyone and no one should have nothing.

Liturgical Reflection ...

General Instruction of the Roman Missal The faithful can proclaim the sacred readings at Mass, except for the Gospel. This person is truly suited to proclaim the reading and is carefully prepared. The reader's ministry aids the faithful to conceive in their hearts the sweet and living affection for Sacred Scripture. In the absence of the Deacon, the reader carries in the *Book of the Gospels*, slightly elevated. He or she places this book on the altar and takes his/her own place in the sanctuary. The reader proclaims Scripture from the ambo. The United States Bishops have recommended a separate reader for each reading. After the second reading, the readers return to their seats. Each faith community decides the age of the reader, the Diocese directs the reader to have received Baptism and Eucharist.
