Scripture Reflection

Six centuries before Christ, on the eve of the Babylonian conquest, Jeremiah speaks an oracle of the Lord that scolds Israel's leaders for failing to shepherd the people of God. These kings have scattered rather than nurtured and led the people, and so the Lord himself will shepherd his people by appointing true shepherds.

Jesus also raised up shepherds to continue to guide the flock. After being sent out to evangelize, the apostles reported back to Jesus on everything "they had done and taught." The Good Shepherd's compassion extended to these protégés, whom Jesus knew needed rest, so he took them to a deserted place. But though they "went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves," they could not find much time alone, for the people had already tracked them down and discerned the place they were going, waiting there when the disciples arrived.

Yet Jesus, when he "saw a great crowd," did not turn from the flock and focus on the shepherds. Jesus' compassion was poured out on the sheep "because they were like sheep without a shepherd." Jesus' compassion instead was a model for the shepherds who would continue his mission. In responding to the needs of the flock, Jesus gives us the priorities of the Good Shepherd: serve the people; care for the people; build up the people. These are the priorities not just of the Good Shepherd; they must be the priorities of all claimed for Christ at Baptism.

Last Sunday, Jesus sent off his disciples two by two to evangelize and heal the suffering. In today's Gospel they return to share their experiences. Jesus declares it is time for all of them to rest and regroup. So it is for us -- it is midsummer and time for rest! Plan some time for yourself in a quiet place. Rest in the beauty of God's creation and allow the time of solitude and quiet to restore your soul.

Catholic Practice *Did you know?*

In Catholic practice there are times when believers genuflect and times when they bow. As a reminder, we genuflect to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle, and we bow to the holy altar where bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. In general practice, we genuflect to the Reserved Blessed Sacrament when entering the church and when leaving the church. Please note: here in the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament the tabernacle was placed by Bishop Howard Carroll in 1960 in the Reservation Chapel to the left of the sanctuary. When genuflecting to the presence of Christ in the tabernacle here in the Cathedral, we turn slightly to the left and genuflect to the tabernacle. (The exception is when arriving by the side alley entrance, we genuflect directly in front of the tabernacle.) If one passes in front of the altar, it is always appropriate to reverently bow. We do not genuflect to the altar except when the consecrated elements are on the altar. When entering a Catholic Church, locate the tabernacle, genuflect in the direction of the Reserved Presence, and genuflect to the tabernacle when leaving.

In the absence of ordained priests and deacons, there may be a need for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to assist with the distribution of the consecrated elements. This Minister is a fully initiated Catholic, having received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. He or she possesses a keen love for the Eucharist. There must be appropriate training for this ministry. The Pastor must submit a formal request to the Bishop to acquire permission for this individual to exercise this ministry, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion must be formally commissioned. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion receive the Body and Blood of Christ from the ordained priest or deacon.
