Scripture Reflection

Ezekiel describes in his parable the coming of the unusual kingdom, comparing it to a tree growing from "a sprig from the lofty top of a cedar. Under it every kind of bird will live; in the shade of its branches will nest winged creatures of every kind." Jesus reimagines this metaphor, comparing the kingdom of God not to a cedar sprig but to something even more unassuming, a mustard seed, which "when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches. so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

The growing shrub is not notable for its majesty but for its purpose. And the purpose of the cedar and the mustard shrub is to offer shelter for birds of every kind. What do these birds represent? Biblical scholars agree that the birds represent the nations, the Gentiles, who will find a home in the branches.

But this is not the only metaphor Jesus uses for the kingdom of God, Jesus uses the parable of the sowing of the seeds to explain how the kingdom is spread to the world. There is a mystery at the heart of the kingdom's growth, here reflected by the unknown growth of the seeds, which stand for the individuals who populate the kingdom.

But just as there is mystery in the sowing and in the growing, there is mystery in the harvesting. The harvesting is the most mysterious of all the agricultural metaphors of the kingdom of God, for it is our destiny to be cut down. While we grow, struggling to root ourselves, threatened with drought, heat or other enemies, we are growing to be harvested. Yet our reaping is not our death, for though the kingdom is mysteriously present in us, embodied and alive, the kingdom truly comes when we are "at home with the Lord."

 The kingdom of God is a central and fundamental concept for Christians. How would you explain the kingdom of God to someone who might ask?


FAITH DAY AT DELGROSSO'S 2015

General
Instruction

Roman Missal

Every celebration of the Mass is directed by the Bishop, either in person or through Priests who are his helpers. When the Bishop is present at Mass where the people are gathered, it is most fitting that he himself celebrates the Eucharist and the gathered priests join him in the sacred action as concelebrants. This is done not for the sake of adding outward solemnity to the rite, but to signify more vividly the mystery of the Church, "the sacrament of unity." When the bishop gathers with his priests at Mass the fullness of the sign of unity is made visible, the Church is gathered with its Bishop, priests and people.
