Scripture Reflection

On this solemnity, the Church contemplates the very nature of God, and the readings show us that all human knowledge of God comes from God's action for and among us. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity whom we know to be our one God. As we celebrate this revelation of God's very being, we ponder the mystery that is beyond us and yet in our very hearts because God has spoken his Word about himself to us.


It is through the revelation of God as Trinity. the divine family, that all other families of the earth would be invited into the covenant family. For the reality of the Trinity did not emerge for the earliest Christians in the context of complex philosophical discussions but in the experience of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As Pope Benedict XVI stated in 2006, "The intimacy of God himself, discovering that he is not infinite solitude but communion of light and love, life given and received in an eternal dialogue between the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit---lover, beloved and love," revealed the relational nature of God through the guidance of the Holy Spirit and by the incarnation of Jesus Christ.

It was by means of the revelation of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit that the early Christians came to know themselves as children of God, adopted into the family and covenant of God. We are welcomed into God's family as joint heirs because of the love of the Trinity for us. The Trinity models the nature of the family by allowing us to experience the source of all love. It is because of the Trinitarian model of love for us and our experience of that love that Jesus instructs us to go out and make the family bigger. We belong in the family of God, but so do those who have not yet come home.

Liturgical Reflection ...

General Instruction of the Roman Missal By an ancient tradition of the Church, the *Collect* or Opening Prayer is usually addressed to God the Father, through Christ, in the Holy Spirit, and is usually concluded with a Trinitarian ending, in the following manner: when the prayer is directed to the Father, "Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever"; when the prayer is directed to the Father, but the Son is mentioned at the end, "Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever"; when directed to the Son, "Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever." The people make this prayer their own by means of the acclamation *Amen*. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, Number 54.
