## Scripture Reflection

The prayer of Jesus in John's Gospel today is very different from the "Our Father" in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. In John's Gospel portrait, Jesus is not teaching his disciples how to pray so much as allowing them to eavesdrop on his own intimate conversation with God. This intimacy is then extended to the disciples, "so they may be one just as we are one". This union makes the disciples true children of God who are now able to share completely in Jesus' joy.


Today's selection from John's Gospel is just a glimpse of this intimate prayer. This high priestly prayer of Jesus has three units: Jesus' prayer for himself (17:1-5), for his disciples (vv.6-19), and for future believers (vv.20-26). Today the Lectionary presents just the middle part of the prayer concerning Jesus' disciples. We are invited to listen as Jesus, whose death is imminent, gives voice to his deepest hopes for his loved ones.

Jesus' concern for his disciples is plainly stated in his prayer. He wishes to share with his followers the union he enjoys with God. The disciples share in God's holiness by accepting God's word through Jesus. The Lord acknowledges the resistance that God's word encounters from the world, that segment of society that is antagonistic toward God. Jesus himself was hated by that world and now, because of God's word, his followers will suffer the same fate. It is for this reason that Jesus prays for them.

Jesus prays on behalf of his disciples for the courage and protection they will need to bear joyful, steadfast witness to a hostile world. We are to make the prayer of Jesus our prayer. May God be glorified in the proclamation of the good news of Jesus Christ. May we believers be transformed by the power and truth of the gospel. And may others come to believe through us and how we witness to the gospel in word and deed. It takes courage to witness to our faith. We join Jesus in praying for that courage.

#### **Challenges For The Parish**

This week the Department of Code Enforcement of the City of Altoona officially condemned the former school building. Bricks are falling off the structure. The former convent building is close to follow. As was stated earlier in the bulletin, the Parish Finance Council and the Parish Pastoral Council looked into renovating either structure. Having contacted an engineer, the lower cost was \$1.7 million for each building to be renovated and meet code requirements. Both the former school and convent buildings are slated to be razed. We are presently seeking bids on this project. The future use of the property is for much needed parking.

The Parish is in need of space for religious education, sacramental formation, and parish offices. The former Kopp Building (next to the rectory) has been presented to the Cathedral Parish for sale. In light of our needs, both the Finance Council and Parish Council have unanimously supported proceeding with this purchase. The final papers are presently being drawn together for the sale of this property. This is a former warehouse and there is an immediate need to make classrooms for religious education. Religious Education classes have been taking place in the hall for the past year and a half. This is an historic time for the Cathedral Parish as we plan for the future. Each of us will be called upon to be stewards of our time, talent, and treasure. More information will be forthcoming.

## Liturgical Reflection ...

General Instruction of the Roman Missal

The dignity of the Word of God requires that in the church there be a suitable place from which it may be proclaimed and toward which the attention of the faithful naturally turns during the Liturgy of the Word. It is appropriate that generally this place be a stationary ambo and not simply a movable lectern. The ambo is located in keeping with the design of each church in such a way that the ordained ministers and readers may be seen and heard by the faithful. From the ambo only the scriptural readings, the Responsorial Psalm, and Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) are proclaimed. The dignity of the ambo requires that only a minister of the word stands at it.
