Scripture Reflection

Last week the Gospel used shepherd imagery; this week the Scriptures employ agricultural images with the vine and the branches. John emphasizes the fundamental and necessary relationship with God by presenting himself as the plant and us as the branches of that plant closely connected to him for our nourishment and life. Jesus describes a close union with God, who prunes us, the branches, so that we can change and thrive. In this way we have a more fruitful and deeper spiritual life, producing the fruit of virtue and charitable actions. This pruning occurs because the Word has been spoken to us. As the Word takes up a home within us and speaks to our hearts we become the disciples Christ calls us to be.

There can be no truth or justice without judgment, but we often set ourselves as the true arbiters of judgment, even if it is in the guietness of our hearts where we whisper condemnation of the "others," however we may categorize and group them. But this is not our personal task. Jesus is "the true vine" and God "is the vinegrower." It is God who "removes every branch that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit." We have no need to condemn, for we do not know how God is pruning others or ourselves, preparing us to flourish in growth and fruitfulness.


God looks at us. whoever we are, at whatever point we are in our lives, however far we have strayed, and asks that we "bear much fruit and become my disciples." Do not fear the other disciples; just attempt to become one more firmly rooted in the soil that nourishes us all, entwined with the vine and pruned by the loving hands of the vine grower.

The Church celebrates the Paschal Mystery on the first day of the week, known as the Lord's Day or Sunday. This follows a tradition handed down from the apostles and having its origin from the day of Christ's resurrection. The fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as one feast day, or better as one "great Sunday." These above all others are the days for the singing of the *Alleluia*. Throughout the Sundays of Easter Time, it is obligatory to celebrate the Masses for Easter.
