Scripture Reflection

One phrase ties together today's readings, "Remain in my love." In both the Old and New Testaments, God's love is shown to be eternally offered and eternally present. Today's readings invite us to enter, participate, and dwell in that love. As the embodiment of divine love, Jesus speaks of a chain of everlasting love: the Father loves the Son and in the same manner the Son loves us. Thus, we should continue the chain by loving one another. It is a condition or state of love which produces joy and obedience to God's commandments.

In the First Reading from Acts, Peter speaks about how the love of God is manifest: the Holy Spirit comes to whoever listens to the Word of God, and is confirmed in those whose faith in the name of the Lord Jesus leads them to Baptism. There is an inherent wildness in the Holy Spirit, a sort of untameability or unmanageableness, and the work of the Holy Spirit can challenge old ways of thinking and acting. It certainly challenged the early church, as we see in the extended encounter between Peter and Cornelius in the Acts of the Apostles.


In the Gospel, Christ directs us to love one another in the same way that he has loved us. The ultimate sign of that love is that he laid down his life for his friends, including us. Jesus' relationship with the Father has been shared with us, and thus our bond with him has changed from that of slaves to that of friends. "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you"---this love of God and neighbor, the same as it ever was and made completely new in the Holy Spirit.

General
Instruction
of the
Roman Missal

On Sundays there are three readings and a psalm assigned to the Liturgy of the Word. The first reading is from a Prophet, the sung Psalm follows, the second reading is from an Apostle, and the third reading is always from one of the four Gospels. These scriptural selections instruct the Christian people in the continuity of the work of salvation according to God's wonderful design. These readings are to be followed strictly. In Easter Time, according to the tradition of the Church, instead of being from the Old Testament, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles.
