Scripture Reflection

Jesus repeatedly appears to the disciples in those confusing days following their discovery of the empty tomb. The Gospel tells us they felt "incredulous for joy" as they began to develop their Resurrection faith. Jesus stands in the midst of his disciples and wishes peace to a "startled and terrified" group. As when he meets the doubtful Thomas, Jesus gently asks why they are troubled and why they have questions rising in their hearts. Then he offers both comfort and proof that he had truly risen (he is not a ghost). First, he suggests that they touch and see him, and second, he shows he is able to eat with them. As with the Emmaus story at the beginning of chapter twenty-four, this is a Eucharistic story in which Jesus explains the Scripture and eats with his followers.

"You are witnesses of these things," but to what are we witnesses today? None of us saw him die on the cross, or watched him eat that piece of boiled fish, feeling faint with joy and amazement as we saw him alive in our midst. We are witness to two things: the authenticity and trustworthiness of the witnesses; and the authenticity and trustworthiness of our lives.


In our lives, we have choices each day. We have the ability to show the world the reality of the risen Lord through our love, our obedience, our tenderness, our mercy, our gentleness, our desire to live out and witness to Christ's victory through our daily choices. We bear witness to the one who was raised from the dead when we believe the words the apostles passed on to us. We believe in their trustworthiness about Jesus because we live out their love for Jesus. We live as Jesus asked us to, passed on to us by the tradition. How we live makes us witnesses to Jesus Christ. It is our task today to bear witness.

Liturgical Reflection ...

General
Instruction
of the
Roman Missal

The Homily is a central part of Mass. It is necessary for the nurturing of the Christian life. It should be an explanation of some aspect of the readings from Sacred Scripture or of another text from the Roman Missal. The Homily should take into account both the mystery being celebrated and the particular needs of the listeners. The Homily is ordinarily given by the Priest Celebrant or can be entrusted to a concelebrating Priest or to the Deacon, but never to a lay person. It is especially recommended to have a Homily on the weekdays of Easter Time.
