Scripture Reflection

We have no trouble hearing the basic message of the Transfiguration as it speaks to us with our hindsight. Many listeners are aware that, although the verses are not a part of this reading, the Transfiguration story comes soon after the first prediction of the Passion and Resurrection of Christ, just eight verses earlier. So today's story is a consoling reminder that Jesus' Passion and Death will indeed result in the glory of the Resurrection of the Son of Man. Already, this early in Lent, we get a glimpse of Easter.

But the God who showed them a vision of heavenly glory and spoke to them out of the glory was the same God who spoke to them when Jesus said that he would suffer and die. When you listen to God, you do not get to pick just the "good stuff," the words that appeal to you: God asks that you listen always.

But trials, tests and suffering are not the end of the story. Paul asks us in Romans, "What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else?" The end of the story is God's glory, but it requires hearing God's voice in the midst of trials, suffering, pain and loss, even when it seems to be God's voice commanding the suffering. Be patient and listen again, for the voice of God desires only our blessing.

• God is with us ~ in good times and in bad times. Remember a blessing you received and remember a cross you bore. Did you experience the presence of God in both circumstances?

The scrutinies are not only for our Elect and Candidates, but also for us, the fully initiated. We are to look deeply and seriously at our lives these Lenten days and see what needs to be cleansed of sin and what calls us closer to our God. Please enter the next three weeks with open hearts as we prepare to die and rise with Christ after the forty days of Lent. At the conclusion of the First Scrutiny, our Elect and Candidates receive the gift of the Creed from the assembled at Mass. Those preparing for the Easter Sacraments will stand throughout the body of the Cathedral Church and receive the Profession of Faith from parishioners gathered at the 10:00 AM Mass.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal makes specific references to the Season

of Lent. The Glory to God is not prayed during the Sundays of Lent. During Lent, instead of the Alleluias, the Verse before the Gospel is sung. During Lent it is forbidden for the altar to be decorated with flowers (exceptions are the Fourth Sunday of Lent, solemnities and feasts). The playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only in order to support the singing. The color violet or purple reflects the seriousness of the season. The Sundays of Lent are prayed without exception; no other choice of Mass is permitted. A Funeral Mass may not be celebrated on Sundays of Lent, Holy Thursday, and the Paschal Triduum (Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter)
