Scripture Reflection

Although the Passion Narratives of all four Gospels are similar in many ways, there are also significant differences among them. In Mark's Passion the *suffering* of Jesus is highlighted more so than in the other three narratives. Jesus is tragically rejected, unfairly condemned, viciously beaten, horribly insulted, and cruelly mistreated by multiple groups. The cross is central to Mark's Passion; the cross is salvation. The way of discipleship is the way of suffering.

Mark narrates vividly Jesus' anguish in the garden. This Gospel does not flinch from the most brutal aspects of the torture and execution - the scourging, mocking, and crowning of thorns. Yet the Evangelist writes from the viewpoint of Easter faith, which is rooted in the mystery of the cross. While the called disciples flee, the women who had followed him in Galilee stand at the cross. The profession of Jesus as Son of God is uttered by the Gentile centurion. And Jesus dies with a cry, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

Mark's Jesus is deserted and abandoned. He is physically abused; thus, the anointing at the beginning of the story, preparing his body for what lies ahead. The statement of total aloneness on the cross, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" Is this despair or an unfinished lament that ends in triumphant hope? Easter faith professes that Jesus identifies himself with the persecuted upright man who has trusted God, and found in God the source of his consolation and ultimate triumph.

With Mark's Passion Narrative we are ushered into Holy Week. We enter Jerusalem where we will die and rise with the Lord. Mark makes no attempt to soften the cruelty and pain. Are we ready to enter the holy city? Do we accept the cross in our lives? The tree of defeat becomes the tree of victory. We prepare ourselves to journey the way of the cross-sometimes alone and abandoned, sometimes hurt and in pain, but always under the sign of our salvation and hope. We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.


