Scripture Reflection

We tend to think of the magi as three kings arriving a few days behind the shepherds at the Christmas cave. Matthew would be charmed but would likely remind us that magi are not kings but eastern astrologers and interpreters of dreams. That the number three, a good guess from the number of gifts, is not really part of the story, and that the location is not a cave but the house where the Holy Family is living in Bethlehem. The star, no real help to pinpoint a local address, recalls the prophecy of the astrologers Balaam in Numbers 24:17 and highlights the significance of Jesus's birth within the whole sweep of the story of Israel. Other elements of Matthew 2 recall Israel's story: travel into and out of Egypt, escape from an abusive ruler, and the vocation to be Isaiah's light for the nations (Isaiah 60:1-6; 49:6).

This highly symbolic narrative turns out to be a brilliant way of telling real history. Herod the Great was indeed a contemporary pharaoh (recalling Israel's slavery in Egypt)--famous for his great building projects and a murderous ruler. In the end, Jesus truly does turn out to be a king, whose nonviolent power challenged abusive secular power. Jesus was indeed rejected by the religious leadership of this day ("chief priests and scribes"). And Jesus would be accepted, indeed done homage, more widely by Gentiles than by the historic people of Israel. He would prove to be a new Moses leading his people on a new Exodus. This descendant of David will, as risen Lord, turn out to be everything suggested by the words Matthew quotes from Micah 5:1 (ruler from Bethlehem) and 2 Samuel 5:3 (shepherd of God's people Israel". "God's people Israel" entails all twelve tribes, the restoration of Israel expected in the Messianic age, the Church.

This Sunday we give thanks that Christ came for all people throughout history. Jesus is Lord of all nations and peoples. As believers, we must make the light shine in the darkness so everyone can walk in God's own light. As Christians, we must make certain that Christ the light shines brightly bringing hope, compassion, understanding, patience, forgiveness, and love among all people.

• How do I make the light of Christ shine in my life? When people see me, do they see Christ?

Cathedral Parish in Midst of Decision Making

There is a need to provide a permanent space for Religious Education for the Parish. Last winter the furnace broke in the former school building. Since that time religious education classes have been occurring in the Cathedral Hall on a temporary basis. Renovation and upgrades to meet building codes for either the former convent building or school building have been estimated by engineers at \$1.7 million for each building. A three story building is presently for sale next to the rectory. This building could provide: (1) office space on the first floor for the parish (moving the office from the rectory into a site separate from the residency for the clergy); (2) Religious Education on the second floor for Pre-K through eighth grade along with Catechesis of the Good Shepherd: (3) the third floor (lower level) could be an activities center with a kitchen and open area to seat a large number of people. The cost of purchase and renovation of this possible building is estimated to be half of the cost to upgrade either of the two other buildings. We realize this decision will involve seeking gifts from parishioners to make this project possible. Councils from the parish continue to meet to discuss the possibility of this project. Please pray with us as we review and discuss the facts surrounding this decision.

General Instruction of the

Roman Missal

Third Edition

The Roman Missal is promulgated to the universal Church throughout the world. It is the official book of Catholic worship at Mass for over 1.3 billion believers. On this Epiphany Sunday, we recall that Jesus Christ is revealed as Lord of all peoples and nations. Jesus Christ is Savior and Redeemer of all the earth. The prayers contained in the Roman Missal are translated into every tongue on the globe. The Missal gives witness to the sacrificial nature of the Mass, the ministerial Priesthood, and the real and perpetual presence of Christ under the Eucharistic species. We enter into the paschal mystery at every Mass. We die and rise with our Lord in the celebration of the Eucharist. Today we celebrate Christ as the Light of the world.
