Scripture Reflection

In the Gospel, the dishonest steward has squandered his master's property and is fired. He solves the problem of his future livelihood by drastically lessening the debts of those who owe the master. Stewards in Palestine at this time were free to make money on the side by charging and pocketing high interest rates. So when the steward slashes the debts, he is most likely forfeiting his own profits and not the master's, knowing that the debtors will treat him well in the future. In doing this he is praised by the master-- not for his dishonesty, but for his prudence in arranging for others to be indebted to him.

The complexity of the parable of the dishonest manager, found in Luke's Gospel alone, led some of the church fathers to cut to the heart of the matter. Emphasis is on the repentance of the manager that led to his proper use of earthly wealth. Cyril of Alexandria, in his commentary on this passage said: "Let those of us who possess earthly wealth open our hearts to those in need. Let us show ourselves faithful and obedient to the laws of God." Ambrose of Milan focuses on the manager's repentance and subsequent use of money, which he extols "so that by giving to the poor, we may match the grace of the angels and all the saints for ourselves. He does not rebuke the steward... Although he has sinned, he is praised because he sought help for himself in the future through the Lord's mercy."

At its heart, today's Gospel commands each one of us to strive to be persons of Gospel integrity. People of Gospel integrity are honest, trustworthy, and act out of their core beliefs. In the spirit of Saint Francis of Assisi, people preach the Gospel at all times through their daily choices and behaviors. People of Gospel integrity understand that they are stewards of material possessions, not owners. They readily share what they have with those they know to be in need.

Take an inventory of your charitable contributions thus far this year. Does your giving reflect generous stewardship?
