#### Scripture Reflection

Humility has always been an essential attitude in the spiritual life. Taming our human tendencies toward self-importance can be a challenge. The author of Sirach teaches that humility brings more honor than gift giving. And, the important person who is humble will find favor with God. Being humble is accepting the truth that one's state and status in life come from God, not from a person's own initiative.

In the Gospel parable, Jesus continues to affirm the place of humility in the life of those who would enter the kingdom of God. He tells a parable that could sound like advice on etiquette (how to avoid embarrassment at a dinner party), but it is rooted in a teaching about humility. To those who have been trying to find places of honor at the table, he advises taking the lowest place, for "every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." The implied teaching is that the banquet of the kingdom is open to all; God's grace is inclusive, not exclusive. The one who is humble enough to recognize that always receives the best place, no matter where it is.

The parable sets human honor in its proper place; it is arbitrary and based on shifting cultural considerations. God seeks out humility because humility is not intended to dishonor any particular person but to give glory and honor to God and to respect each person as a creation of God. True honor is recognizing in humility our glory before God, not before human beings.

• Contemplate the honor God has given each of us as beloved creations. Is it difficult for you not to receive honor from others? Do you recognize the honor with which God has endowed you? How do you recognize and honor each person as God's creation?
