# Scripture Reflection

Some preachers have given Martha a bad rap. She is portrayed as the complainer and Mary as the good sister who honors Jesus by sitting and listening to him. Other commentators say that when Luke wrote his Gospel for the early Church he was responding to their search for the meaning of discipleship. Was it found in service or in contemplation?

Martha was made for our time: busy with many things, seeking to be recognized and also, it must be said, trying to do her best. We meet her in Luke's Gospel when Jesus comes to visit the two sisters, Mary and Martha, in their home. Mary sat at Jesus' feet and "listened to his word," while Martha was busy with "much service." Jesus does not take up Martha's cause, instead he challenges Martha by pointing out that she is "worried" and "distracted" by her service. Jesus says that only "one thing is necessary" and that Mary has chosen the "better portion."

Martha is by no means a negative figure, as hospitality is an essential gift to others, but she is a slightly harried figure. Jesus says that "one thing is necessary," and this is to find Christ in our midst and to be with him, as Mary was. How will we find Christ in our midst if we do not slow down? We all have the potential to be Mary, but our age, for all of its great gifts makes it hard to be the one who quiets down and listens.

The evangelist is telling us that there are two elements in ministry: to listen attentively and to act lovingly. Like Mary we listen to the teaching of the Lord; like Martha we also serve. The true disciple is the one who can serve without forgetting to listen, and who can listen without forgetting to serve.

• Do you identify with Mary or Martha? Meditate on your own worry and distractions. What pulls you away from being present with Jesus? Does your service to others lead you closer to the Lord?
