Scripture Reflection

Only the Gospel of Luke includes the narrative of the sending of the seventy-two disciples to prepare the way for Jesus. When Jesus sends the disciples to "every town and place he intended to visit" they became both migrants and missionaries. In some places they were unwelcome and their message not well received.

We can identify. Often our individual efforts to bring the Word of God to bear on a situation, a relationship, or a course of action can seem fruitless. And yet Jesus sends the disciples ahead of him. At other times disciples follow, and in a sense we always follow him. In another sense, he comes after us, gathering up the results of our labor to present to the Father.

The seventy-two are sent totally dependent upon God and mutually dependent upon others, carrying only their experience of Jesus and the power to heal. If rejected, they are to shake the dust off their feet but still announce that God's kingdom is at hand. Some say this means that if the message will be received it will happen when people are ready. When they return, they learn to boast not in themselves, but that their "names are written in heaven." Their boast is God and the only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ.

Pope Francis reminds us that as Church we are to proclaim the good news of Jesus, "so that faith in him might spread to every corner of the earth". We are missionaries whose lives proclaim the joy of the gospel. We are dependent upon God for everything: faith, talents, the ability to develop our talents, and live. We are mutually dependent upon one another. No one is an island, even in our highly individualistic society. When sick, I need someone to help me. When in need, people turn to others for assistance. God's comfort is known by how we accept our mission to live the gospel and share the gifts God has given us.

The Holy Doors for the Jubliee Year of Mercy ...

The Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown is commemorating the Holy Doors associated with the Jubilee of Mercy with three parishes in our local church celebrating their two hundredth anniversary. Servant of God Demetrius Gallitzin was pastor of these parishes in 1816. This is the bicentennial anniversary of these faith communities and the Diocese recognizes this milestone of our shared history in these Allegheny Mountains.

The Holy Doors are located at *Saint Patrick Church*, Newry, *Saint Thomas the Apostle Church*, **Bedford**, and *Holy Name Church*, **Ebensburg**. You may visit any or all of the three churches on these Sundays: <u>July 10</u> and <u>July 24</u>; and <u>August 14</u> and <u>August 28</u>, from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM. Prayers are publicly prayed on the half hour: 1:30 PM, 2:00 PM, 2:30 PM, 3:00 PM, 3:30 PM, and 4:00 PM.

A Plenary Indulgence is available to anyone walking through these three holy doors. An indulgence is a divnely recognized remission or removal of temporal punishment for sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. One prays the Apostles' Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for the intentions of the Holy Father; one also prays the Jubilee Prayer created for this Holy Year of Mercy. (Pamphlets are provided.) And the Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist are received within an appropriate time of passing through the designated doors.

Gluten Sensitivity

There may be parishioners who have found that they have physical disorders related to gluten intolerance. The spectrum of illnesses includes celiac disorder, wheat allergy, bloating, abdominal discomfort, diarrhea, muscular disturbances, and bone or joint pain.
