## Scripture Reflection

One quality is essential for being a disciple---commitment. When Elisha asks the prophet's permission to kiss his parents good-bye, Elijah answers somewhat ambiguously, but Elisha realizes this is the hour of decision. He not only kills and cooks his oxen but burns the plow they came with, wiping out all connection to his past trade. There is no report on how his parents felt about this, but it signals Elisha's commitment.

Somewhere in the course of our personal lives each of us comes to face the question of commitment, to its risks and its unknowns. Some, out of fear, turn away. Others, because they seek comfort, refuse the challenge. Still others, too enamored of the banquet of choices before them, never decide and so never commit. Finally there are also those who step into the swirling darkness and say yes, simply because they realize only too well that if they do not, a life of any significance will be less likely from that moment onward.

Jesus outlines the fitness program his disciples must measure up to: an ability to live without the comforts of home, a freedom from any ties to family that might prevent preaching the kingdom of God, and the ability to live such a life with total commitment and without any regret. All this is the work of the Spirit within us, liberating us from what can hold us in place and helping bring God's kingdom into the world.

For Jesus, the call to do the work of the Father is an urgent and critical decision; it means accepting the mission of the Kingdom without condition or hesitation. Jesus offers this choice to all of us; not just once but many times.

#### Establishment to Liturgical Status of Feast ...

The Church's liturgical calendar celebrates with **Saint Mary Magdalene** every **July 22**. This commemoration, previously a memorial, has been *raised to the status of a Feast*. Pope Francis made this decision in the context of the Jubilee of Mercy to highlight the relevance of this woman who showed great love for Christ and who was much loved by Christ. While most liturgical celebrations of individual saints during the year are known as memorials, those classified as feasts are reserved for important events in Christian history and for saints of particular significance, such as the Twelve Apostles. Known as the "apostle of the Apostles" because she is the first to witness the empty tomb and the first to listen to the truth of the resurrection, Jesus had a special consideration and mercy for this woman, who manifests her love for him, looking for him in the garden with anguish and suffering. Saint Mary Magdalene's feast day is a call for Christians to reflect more deeply on the dignity of women, the new evangelization, and the greatness of the mystery of divine mercy.
