Scripture Reflection

Luke often describes Jesus in prayer, staying close to the Father, seeking to know the Father's will, and discerning the focus of his ministry. Today's Gospel begins with Jesus "praying in solitude" just before he opens a probing conversation with the disciples, a conversation that takes the disciples into frightening new territory.

Jesus asks, "Who am I?" The disciples report that the crowds see Jesus as a prophet. But Jesus is also the Messiah--a challenge to the crowds, religious leaders, and his own disciples. Many expected the Messiah to overthrow the political oppressors of Israel. Jesus understands his mission differently; he wants to know if the disciples have come to that awareness. Peter responds correctly, but Jesus proceeds to describe exactly what that will mean in the days ahead. Jesus' Death and Resurrection are hard for the disciples to fathom, and harder still to accept is the news that in following Jesus, they too will be asked to endure their own cross.

Our cross may not be the literal suffering and death that Jesus endured; it is found in many ways throughout life when we deny our own comfort and place ourselves at the service of others. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy we practice the corporal works of mercy: feeding the hungry; giving drink to the thirsty; clothing the naked; sheltering the homeless; caring for the sick; visiting the imprisoned; and burying the dead. We are also busy practicing the spiritual works of mercy: converting sinners; instructing the ignorant; advising the doubtful; comforting the sorrowful; bearing wrongs patiently; forgiving injuries; and praying for the living and the dead.

• What do you consider to be your cross in life? How does prayer sustain you? Is your life filled with service to others in the name of the Lord?
