Scripture Reflection

John does not have Jesus praying in the garden of Gethsemane but at the Last Supper. Jesus prays to the Father for his disciples and for all who will hear their words about him. He prays that all may be one. The ending that God has planned for all who believe in Jesus is that we enter into unity with Jesus and the Father and the Holy Spirit.

In the reading from John's account of the Gospel, Jesus' prayer for unity expresses a carefully thought out identity of Jesus. He prays for his disciples, earnestly desiring that they come to know the same intimate union with him that he has with the Father. This union springs from the love of God for Jesus and his love for those the Father has given him. The love of the disciples will be a sign to the world that Jesus has come from the Father and will in turn bring glory to God.

Jesus prays for the unity of all believers, a unity that does not merely resemble the unity that exists between Jesus and his Father, but actually participates in it. Furthermore, joined to Jesus, believers share in the glory of Jesus that was manifested through his death, resurrection, and exaltation. Believers are to manifest this divine union to the world so that the world will see not only that God sent Jesus, but also that God loves believers with the same love with which Jesus is loved. Having made God's name known to believers, Jesus asks that these believers might be with him. If the love with which God loves Jesus resides in those who believe in him, Jesus himself will abide in them.

• In the Gospel of John this is Jesus' final prayer. The Lord prays for unity. Are you busy creating unity among your family, friends, community, and the Church?
