Scripture Reflection

Easter Time ends with the celebration of Pentecost. For fifty days the Church has been immersed in the mystery of new life with the risen Lord, a mystery that draws us into the relationship of Jesus and the Father. In the Resurrection, Jesus breaks the bonds of human limitations and promises that we too will be raised. In the Ascension, the Father receives the beloved Son into the divine realm. and with the sending of the Spirit, we become a dwelling place of the Advocate, who reminds us of all the Lord has told us.

The Spirit of Pentecost is not confined by language, place of origin, gender, or social status; it is a universal gift that reminds us to put flesh, bones, hands, and feet on the teaching of Christ. It calls us to the mighty works of God, speaking them ourselves and seeing them in others. The gift of the Spirit is our source of life, not only for fifty days, but every day.

The Spirit works in different ways, sometimes moving us out of our comfortable places into a world of uncertainly and danger. Sometimes the Spirit fires our minds and hearts to say and do things we never would have thought possible. And sometimes the Spirit works in quiet ways through gifts given to each of us for the good of the community. The power of one is ultimately the power of our one God. whom we acknowledge as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is one in many, unity in diversity. And we are to mirror that unity in diversity by allowing the power of the Spirit to work in us as a community.

THE END OF EASTER SEASON

February 10 was Ash Wednesday. The forty days of Lent, the Three Days of Christ's death and Resurrection (March 27 was Easter Sunday), and the fifty days of Easter conclude with today's celebration of Pentecost. The Sacraments have been celebrated with great joy these fifty days of Easter time - those who received the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil, our children who received their First Holy Communion, those who were anointed in the communal Anointing of the Sick, our high school students who received Confirmation, and our infants who were baptized on the Sundays of Easter. And yesterday, a permanent deacon was ordained for the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown and two men were ordained as transitional Deacons, looking forward to Priesthood ordination next year. Marriage was the only Sacrament not celebrated in the Cathedral, these Easter days! We are grateful for all the blessings we have received these days of grace.

Easter Evening Prayer

On every Sunday of the Easter Season Cathedral Parish has celebrated the sprinkling rite, reminding us of our Baptism and has gathered at 6:30 PM for Evening Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in exposition. This liturgy begins around the Easter Candle that has been lit at all Masses. The Easter Season concludes with Evening Prayer this Pentecost Sunday. The Easter Candle is then placed near the baptismal font where it is displayed with honor. In the baptismal rite, the candles of the newly baptized are lit from the Easter Candle. Ordinary Time resumes on Monday following Pentecost, May 16.
