Scripture Reflection

The Gospel story of the death and raising of Lazarus is a prelude to the events of Jesus' own death and Resurrection. It includes another of the "I am" statements by Jesus. In speaking with Martha he proclaims, "I am the resurrection and the life." Those who believe in him will not be separated from him, even in death. In the midst of the story some bystanders taunt him, asking, "could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something?" In a similar way he will be mocked when he is on the cross: "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself."

The Gospel presents a striking picture of Jesus, who, despite his love for Lazarus, delays his return until Lazarus has died, in order that his disciples might come to greater belief. Sandwiched between Lazarus' death and Jesus' raising him from the dead is Jesus' encounter with Martha, Lazarus' sister. In conversation between Jesus and the Samaritan woman, Jesus had identified himself as the Messiah. Here in another theological discussion with Martha he declares; "I am the resurrection and the life." Martha responds affirmatively. "I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God." And yet this Messiah is not beyond human emotion. Jesus begins to weep at the tomb of Lazarus.

Today's Gospel from John has great baptismal symbolism. One particular example is found in the words of Jesus, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live. and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die" (John 11:25-26). That concept means that when one is baptized, the presence of Christ is already realized in that person. Christ's words stress that the spiritual life of the Christian, which begins at baptism, will never die. Lent leads us to professing a faith that is life-giving. Do you believe in God the Father almighty? Do you believe in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord? Do you believe in the Holy Spirit? Are you ready to answer? The good thing is that we answer as a community, as a body, supporting each other in faith.

• Disciples of Jesus believe not that life ends in death but that death ends in life. God offers us new life. Let us invite Jesus to heal us and bring us to life by leaving our tombs, becoming unbound, and letting each other go free.

Liturgical Reflection ...

The fifth week of Lent the Diocese affirms the Corporal Work of Mercy to **visit the imprisoned**. Get in touch with prison chaplains who can tell how to reach out to inmates. Sometimes it is possible to send cards especially during the holidays; this would require a parent's permission obviously. We cannot overlook the mode of visiting anonymously by prayer. You might ask God to send some special strength or comfort to the prisoners who feel most despairing at that moment, to a prisoner whose health or life is in danger, to a prisoner who has been unjustly sentenced or abandoned by his family. Followers of the condemned Christ are challenged to reach out to those condemned and sentenced in our day. God's mercy is evident in our actions.
