Scripture Reflection

The first thing Jesus did in his public ministry was to align himself with John the Baptist's call to repentance and reconciliation among God's people. Jesus entered into solidarity with Israel, responding to John's call for the baptism of all Israel to prepare for God's coming kingdom. Jesus saw the baptism for the forgiveness of sins as the means by which his own ministry would begin, both at personal and community levels. For Jesus, the baptism was the mysterious start of his mission, and act in unity with fallen humanity but also the point at which the heavens opened, the Holy Spirit descended on him and a voice from heaven spoke, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." Jesus' own mission was now to start.

At the ecclesial level, Jesus was baptized "when all the people were baptized," not only as a sign of solidarity with Israel but also to prepare them for the baptism of the Holy Spirit, which John had told the people the coming Messiah would bring to them. The people were ready, wondering whether John himself might be the Messiah. John's baptism was, therefore, the necessary sign that another baptism of water and spirit was coming with the Messiah. A new people of God was being constituted. Jesus, the servant of God, was not after all alone as a light to the nations. A new Israel would walk with him, baptized with water and the Holy Spirit.

Today ends the Christmas season. We put away the singing of Christmas carols, like "Joy to the World," but not living their words. Because we put on Christ in baptism, we too are beloved daughters and sons of God. The Holy Spirit has been poured out on us. We do more than point the way to Christ like John the Baptizer; we are called to live Jesus. Baptism makes us heralds of glad tidings who announce that God is with us, offering comfort and speaking tenderly. Our lives proclaim "here is your God" in small ways that speak loudly. Be a living carol that sings joy to the world, the Lord is come for all.

This represents 97% of our \$1.2 million goal and this total has been generated through the sacrificial generosity of approximately 260 parishioners and families. Once again, we are most grateful to our donors for their commitment and sacrifice to the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament Parish and ask that the remainder of our Parish Family join them in this important project.
