# Scripture Reflection

The Solemnity of the Epiphany was once called "Little Christmas," and the story of the Magi was one of the four "epiphanies" or manifestations that surrounded God's intervention in human history. The birth of Christ, his baptism, and the miracle of the wedding feast of Cana are the other three. Each of these signs gives a different insight on Christ's coming. How does Matthew tell his Epiphany story?

The first Gentiles encountered in Matthew's Gospel are magi from the East who seek the new king of the Jews. The word *magos* originally referred to a member of the Persian priestly class, and later was used of those who engaged in Eastern philosophy and sciencehence magicians and astrologers. The magi report seeing a star rising, which, in popular understanding, signaled the birth of a significant person. This star directs the magi to Bethlehem, where they found the "king" in very humble circumstances. The magi pay homage to baby Jesus, presenting him with gifts befitting a king: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Today we celebrate the appearance of Christ to the Gentiles, told in the story of the Magi following the bright star that led to the newborn King. Their story invites us to reflect on their willingness to journey so far to meet Jesus and their reverence for mystery. Matthew tells us the magi receive a warning not to return to Herod--a warning in a dream. In the Bible, dreams alert humans that certain occurrences are not what they seem. The Magi "departed for their country by another way." Once one encounters an "epiphany" of divine origins, life is changed.


