# Scripture Reflection

Our Gospel from Luke today is a tale of God's actions through the devout to produce future hope. The parents of Jesus are presented by Luke as devout observers of the Jewish law who fulfilled what was required of them to do for Jesus. Only in this Gospel do we read about Mary and Joseph taking the infant Jesus to Jerusalem to fulfill the Law (Luke 2:22-24). While there they meet two godly people. Simeon is described as "righteous and devout" and Anna as a prophetess who "never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer" (2:25, 37).

Families are so different. Many families have a mother and a father living together with children. Some families have children living with a mother; some have children living with a father. In other families, stepsisters and stepbrothers and half sisters and half brothers live together. Some families have no sisters or brothers at all. Some families have a husband and wife, and no children. Some families have grandparents living with their grandchildren. Some have uncles or aunts or nieces or nephews living with them. Some families have one single person living alone in the house. Some families are made up of two people that are really good friends and enjoy being roommates. But the one thing all families have in common is love.

Today's Gospel passage is about the initial and long-term maintenance of the relationship with God and the hopes to which such a life leads. Mary and Joseph start their son out on the right foot, and Simeon and Anna have grown old in righteousness and worship. Beginning and maintaining the relationship with God opens one to God's future expansive plans.

The Church encourages various accommodations to the cultures and traditions of particular regions. Today is a wonderful opportunity to bless families following the Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful) on this feast of the Holy Family. As families gather for the Christmas holidays for Mass, it is an appropriate occasion to add this prayer to the Eucharist.
