Scripture Reflection

The second book of Samuel records the rule of David, the king of Judah, who joined both Judah and the northern realm of Israel into a united kingdom. In today's reading, David has settled into his palace and now desires to build a temple for God that will house the Ark of the Covenant. But that task will be given to his son, Solomon. Rather than David building God's house, God turns the tables. God will build up the house of David--a dynasty on whom God's favor will rest forever.

The Gospel presents us with the annunciation to Mary, a virgin betrothed to Joseph, of the house of David. The angel Gabriel announces that Mary has found favor with God, though we are not told what she has done to achieve this honor. The promise God made to David will be brought to fruition in Mary's child. He will be given the throne of David and will rule forever. It is not the fulfillment of God's promise that Mary questions, but the mechanics of conception. The angel explains that the Holy Spirit will come upon her, so that the child to be born will be holy, the Son of God.

God will establish David's lineage and his heir shall inherit a throne that will last forever. Christians have long interpreted this promise as finding its fulfillment in Jesus. As the angel tells Mary in the Gospel reading, God will give to Jesus "the throne of David his father." Jesus is the rightful heir to David; he is the one whose kingdom shall last forever. In the birth of Jesus, God is building David's house. But in another sense, God is also building a dwelling place for the divine presence. The dwelling place for God in the midst of the Chosen People, which David sought to build, is now definitively established in Jesus; he is the true temple of God, built not by human hands, but by the work of the Spirit. What we will celebrate at Christmas is the advent of the new dwelling place of God in the humanity of Jesus.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal directs that during Advent the *Glory to God* is not prayed in anticipation of the great feast of Christmas. The floral decoration of the altar is marked by a moderation suited to the character of this time of year, without expressing the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord. In Advent the use of the organ and other musical instruments is marked by a moderation suited to the character of this season. The four Sundays of Advent must always be celebrated and can never be replaced by any other alternative Mass selection. The choice of songs, the scriptures in the Lectionary, and the prayers in the Roman Missal all give witness to the nature of the season of Advent which is hope and anticipation.
