Scripture Reflection

In today's Gospel, the setting for Jesus' teaching is the conflict between different parties in the Jewish community concerning how to serve God, even under the occupation of Rome. Should they pay the tax, as some advocate, or resist to preserve their identity as God's Chosen People? Either answer would inflame some listeners. Roman coins were stamped with the image of the emperor. Jesus avoids the trap, throwing the problem back on each individual while implying that returning the token that the empire had manufactured need not express one's true allegiance. He remains outside the political conflict, trusting in his Father's plan for the people's salvation.

"Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." The coin itself, minted by the Roman state, belongs to Rome, but the denarius portrayed Tiberius as divine, a status reserved for God alone. Perhaps Jesus is saying that in the divine economy, money is not the currency that counts, so give it to those who minted it, which includes deluded earthly rulers. The payment due to the sovereign God alone is worship, and it is owed to no other. And if the things of Caesar and the things of God collide? God is Lord of all.

What do I owe God? We presume to be loval citizens of the state wherein we cherish our freedom and rights. Hence the point of the Gospel--all freedoms and rights come from God alone. We owe Father, Son, and Holy Spirit our lives and our liberties.

Liturgical Reflection ...

The bishops of the world noted that the rites of the liturgy should be marked with noble simplicity. With the reform of the liturgy fifty years ago, the Church desired the Roman Liturgy to be short, clear, and unencumbered by useless repetitions. The rites should be within the comprehension of the people gathered for worship. And, as a rule, the rites should not require much explanation. Scripture is to underscore all that is done at liturgy. In prayer and in song, the holy scriptures ground the Church's worship
