Scripture Reflection

Ezekiel prophesied for the people in exile in Babylon. As the second generation of the exiled community grew to adulthood, like many of us, they blamed their parents for their circumstances. Ezekiel tells them that they are personally responsible for their own decisions. An outwardly virtuous person can still make sinful choices and must face the consequences. God wants sinners to repent, to return to grace, and to live. He wants us to accept responsibility for our actions.

The Second Reading from Philippians, tells us that God's way is always the way of righteousness, though this way can be surprising and baffling, shocking us with the depths of God's mercy. We might as a result stubbornly decide that God's way is "unfair" or attempt to resist God's paths, but the ways of God are the way of compassion. Since it is Jesus, the preeminent model of us, who followed God's ways perfectly, Paul begins his beautiful hymn to Christ by encouraging the Philippians to have "the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose" as did Jesus.

Today's Gospel provides a shock of recognition. The first son's response to his father is "I will not," but afterwards changed his mind and went. The other son responded to his father's request, "Yes, sir," but did not go. Who has not encountered this behavior--in themselves, their children, or friends? The issue is, how much of what we have been taught this far we have taken to heart and acted upon? Jesus makes it clear that he does not want words of faith without actions that show evidence of our sincerity. He is looking for followers with repentant hearts. Genuine, wholehearted, active faith is what God desires.
