Scripture Reflection

Much modern talk about God tends to reduce the creator to a living doll, who wants to give us a divine cuddle. There is no doubt that the essence of God's being is love, but the experience of that love and of God's being is not always an experience of comfort and ease. God can disturb the relaxed meditations of the satisfied and push believers to the breaking point. The awful power of God can overwhelm.

The language of the prophet Jeremiah reflects this experience of the might of God in language that can trouble people even today. The words of Jeremiah, "You duped me, O Lord., and I let myself be duped; you were too strong for me, and you triumphed," can also be translated, "O Lord, you have enticed me, and I was enticed; you have overpowered me, and you have prevailed."

In the Gospel. Peter discovers that following Jesus will have a cost. He is not pleased; he thought he was on a road to glory. So when Jesus said that he would suffer in Jerusalem. Peter said this was not the positive message the people wanted to hear. Jesus' shocking response is: "Get behind me, Satan!" Jesus is telling Peter to be a disciple, to walk in his (Jesus') shoes. He states clearly that following him on the way of the Cross is more important than life itself.

The will of God is not always the easy path, as Jeremiah and Jesus show, but the soul that thirsts for God will be satisfied only by the water that gives life, that allows us to transform our minds and souls and so to discern the will of God.

How do we deal with the fact that Jesus is not giving the positive message that people would rather hear?
