Scripture Reflection


The readings explore what it means to be a leader of God's people. In the First Reading, Isaiah is speaking to Shebna, a man who in times of trouble has not thought of the people, but of his own wants. The kingdom of Judah is being pressed by many enemies, and the people are in need of help. Shebna has responded by allocating funds to build an ostentatious burial chamber for himself. Isaiah proclaims the downfall of Shebna in favor or Eliakim, who is given the tokens of authority to rule in God's name.

While in the region where the pagan Greek god Pan is worshipped, Jesus asks his disciples who the people say that he is. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, Peter proclaims Jesus the Messiah, Son of the living God. In response, Jesus appoints Peter as the leader, the rock on whom he will build the Church. We, who know the story, realize that Peter still has much to learn, but here we witness the insight and devotion that will enable Peter and the popes, his successors, to make the necessary decisions for the direction of the Church. They are assured of God's continuing presence, supporting them in their essential service of governance.

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks Peter, "Who do you say that I am?" That is the most profound and intimate question any person can address to another. Responding to it calls for honesty, love, and commitment. • Allow Jesus to ask you the same question. Make two columns. In one, write at least five responses. In the second, write what commitment that description of Jesus calls forth.

Hence the Lord's Day is the first holy day of all, a day of joy and freedom from work.
