Scripture Reflection

Ask for anything in the world and it will be yours! Usually, in fairy tales and legends, three wishes are granted. Then after poor choices, the truth is discovered about what really matters. Lessons are learned the hard way. The First Book of Kings presents us with a somewhat similar scenario, but with the storied wisdom of young king Solomon on display. He identifies himself, in a humble way, as a mere youth in need of counsel. He asks God to give him "an understanding heart," literally "a listening heart." The heart in the Old Testament refers not to the organ circulating the blood, but to the seat of the intellect and the ability to discern good and evil.

The Gospel uses concrete images---buried treasure, the search for a precious pearl, a net full of fish. Jesus is describing the actions of those who have an "understanding heart," who recognize the value of what they have heard, and who have made a decision and a firm commitment for the Kingdom of Heaven. The disciples have been chosen by God, sifted out to separate them from those who do not choose to follow God. In this way, they enter into his glory.

Like wisdom, but unlike riches, honor or a lengthy human life, the kingdom of heaven can be shared without lessening or diminishing it. There is always more of the kingdom of heaven to share, to offer, to purchase, which is why the image of buying it is both shocking and humorous. There is no less of the kingdom of heaven after you sell all you have to buy it, and anyone else can still buy it too. And most shocking of all, after you buy the kingdom of heaven, the joy of the purchase never diminishes.

• How can you develop a "listening heart"? What attitude towards things must you let go of in order to find the treasure of the Kingdom?

Baptism Congratulations


