Scripture Reflection

The Gospel lets us listen as Jesus talks with God, revealing his intimate relationship to his Abba-Father. Abba is the affectionate name a child uses for a beloved father. Jesus tells us that only if we approach God in humility, ready to learn, trusting that our Father is kind and compassionate, can we experience the rest that Jesus offers us.

Jesus teaches that "unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." This suggests that while literal children are the model disciples, the adult followers of Jesus are able to "change and become like children" in order to enter the kingdom. What is it that children have that the wise and intelligent lack in Jesus' equation? Children are vulnerable, open, trusting, reliant, weak, inferior and must depend upon those with power to protect and care for them. Such reliance opens children to the revelation from the Son. Jesus' way is revealed to infants because the "little ones" model the necessary trust, dependence and reliance upon God the Father that the Son has revealed to them. It is this reliance that the adult disciples of Jesus must demonstrate if they are to become "little ones." Jesus directs us all to become like them and to adopt the proper stance toward God and God's kingdom.

In today's Gospel, we hear of Jesus's joy that the mysteries of the Kingdom have been revealed to the humble. On this holiday weekend, the reading reminds us that what is most important comes not from our own strength but as a free gift from God, who loves us and asks only for our love. • This weekend make a list of the blessings God has freely bestowed on you and give thanks for them. These may include being born into your country or family, privileges you may take for granted like education, electricity, food, and running water in our homes.

The Cathedral received a gift this week from the Estate of Viola A. Franchio. We are most appreciative of her stewardship to the parish.


BISHOP MARK BARTCHAK TO RESIDE AT CATHEDRAL RECTORY

The Bishop has decided to reside here in the Cathedral Rectory. The move will occur during the summer. In consultation with the Diocesan Finance Council and the College of Consultors, the Bishop's residence in Frankstown Township will be sold. Proceeds from the sale of that property will be used for pastoral needs in the Diocese, including care for victims in sexual misconduct cases. This is an historical moment in the life of the Diocese. While Bishop McCort built the Cathedral rectory in the early 1930s to be used as the Bishop's Residence, that did not occur because of the Great Depression that struck our country. This is the first Bishop in our one hundred thirteen years as a Diocese to reside here at the Cathedral. We warmly welcome our shepherd. Bishop Mark Bartchak.
