Scripture Reflection

Today's First and Second Readings tell us about Peter's jail experience and Paul's description of "being poured out like a libation." Both suffered martyrdom. Many may not know that the red hats worn by cardinals in the Church symbolize a willingness to undergo martyrdom for the faith. Today's solemnity invites us to consider how we might be called to sacrifice for our faith.

In today's Gospel, the question for the disciples came from Jesus himself, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" When Jesus asked the disciples to answer the question for themselves, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered boldly, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God," Jesus affirmed Peter in his answer by telling him: "Blessed are you Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven."

Jesus built on the faith of Peter, who had denied him three times, and he would build with the faith of Paul, who had persecuted the church of God. Indeed, Paul continued the work of the Twelve, planting churches throughout the Roman Empire. Paul acknowledged that on human terms he was "unfit to be called an apostle" (1 Cor 15:9), but the Second Letter of Timothy presents Paul offering his last testament, in which he confesses that "I have fought the good +fight, I have finished the race. I have kept the faith." The faith Peter confessed was the faith that Paul maintained and is the faith handed on to us, by which we are built and by which we build the church today.

 Reflect on the faith of Peter and Paul. How does your confession of Jesus the Messiah allow you to grow stronger in your Christian beliefs?

Annual Cathedral Festival

Having met with the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council to discuss the annual parish festival, it is the unanimous opinion not to continue this fund-raiser. Over the last twenty plus years, the parish never made more than \$8,000.00 to \$10,000.00 profit. For many years the gross income exceeded \$42,000,00, but once all bills were paid, the profit normally totaled \$8,000.00. Many attempts were made to positively affect the profit, especially last year with no tent in the parking lot and only two days for the festival, and yet the profit still did not exceed \$8,000.00. When we saw the hundreds of hours in prep, the festival days themselves, and clean up afterwards, it was agreed the actual profit did not justify the hours of labor.

Thank you to all who over the years have given your time, talent, and treasure to the Annual Cathedral Festival. We will work to create annual parish events for families, children, and adults.

Replacing the Annual Festival

A Committee gathered to begin planning an annual calendar of events for the Parish. Some of these events are purely social; others are social along with the purpose of fundraising. Plans were initially set for the second half of this year. (1) In July and August, there will be the Raffle Tickets for the prizes normally held at the summer festival. There will be twenty prizes which include quality items and money. Each ticket will cost \$5.00. (2) A Family Night is scheduled in September for children and families and adults. (3) A Casino Night is scheduled in October. (4) The Married Couples Social is scheduled in November. (5) And the Calendar of Prizes 2015 is scheduled for November and December.

BISHOP MARK BARTCHAK TO RESIDE AT CATHEDRAL RECTORY

The Bishop has decided to reside here in the Cathedral Rectory. The move will occur during the summer. In consultation with the Diocesan Finance Council and the College of Consultors. the Bishop's residence in Frankstown Township will be sold. Proceeds from the sale of that property will be used for pastoral needs in the Diocese, including care for victims in sexual misconduct cases. This is an historical moment in the life of the Diocese. While Bishop McCort built the Cathedral rectory in the early 1930s to be used as the Bishop's Residence, that did not occur because of the Great Depression that struck our country. This is the first Bishop in our one hundred thirteen years as a Diocese to reside here at the Cathedral. We warmly welcome our shepherd, Bishop Mark Bartchak.


FAITH DAY AT DELGROSSO'S 2014
