Scripture Reflection


The apostle Paul would not have been able to define the Trinity, yet he was able with ease to describe the activity and presence of the three persons of the Trinity. It is the experience of God that led to the early formulations of Trinitarian thought. What imposed itself upon these early believers was the experience of God in their midst. It was in Jesus that the nature of God was most fully revealed. It would take some time for the disciples to understand what it meant that Jesus was the Son of God.

When the realization of the true nature of the revelation in Jesus Christ dawned on the church, the nature of God became even clearer. Paul having never met the earthly Jesus, nevertheless through his encounter with the Risen Lord and the growing church could speak of his experience of "the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit." Grace, love and communion: this was the nature of God because Paul had experienced God as love, grace and fellowship.

The Councils of Nicaea, Constantinople and Chalcedon would hundreds of years later try to make sense of the reality attested to in Scripture by Jesus, Paul and the other New Testament authors, but it is important to know that in the mystery of the Cross, the Resurrection, the giving of the Holy Spirit and the experience of God in their midst, the earliest Christians were attempting to be faithful to how God had sojourned among them. How God is one and three and how Jesus is both human and divine were witness to the truth of God, who came to dwell among them, who gave his life for them, who remained in their midst as the Holy Spirit. This was who God was because they experienced the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit.

Annual Cathedral Festival

Having met with the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council to discuss the annual parish festival, it is the unanimous opinion not to continue this fund-raiser. Over the last twenty plus years, the parish never made more than \$8,000.00 to \$10,000.00 profit. For many years the gross income exceeded \$42,000.00, but once all bills were paid, the profit normally totaled \$8,000.00. Many attempts were made to positively affect the profit, especially last year with no tent in the parking lot and only two days for the festival, and yet the profit still did not exceed \$8,000.00. When we saw the hundreds of hours in prep, the festival days themselves, and clean up afterwards, it was agreed the actual profit did not justify the hours of labor.

A committee has been formed to discuss parish events that will replace the annual August festival. We hope to bring in \$10,000.00 to the annual budget. If you wish to be on this committee, please call the Parish Office. The date for the meeting is Thursday, June 26th.

Thank you to all who over the years have given your time, talent, and treasure to the Annual Cathedral Festival. We will work to create annual parish events for families, children, and adults.
