


Who likes to suffer? Who rejoices at the prospect of suffering? Modern psychology would probably reply, "No one with mental and emotional health." And yet, the First Letter of Peter proclaims, "Rejoice . . . that you share in the sufferings of Christ." The key to linking joy and suffering lies in the reason for suffering: because of Christ and in Christ.

In today's Scriptures, the Church reminds us again that the Paschal Mystery we celebrate is not a single event in time but a continuing passage through suffering and death to glory. Christians of every age are called to enter into this movement, at each particular moment remembering the whole. Throughout our daily lives, all share in the Paschal Mystery. In our joys and sorrows, our hopes and disappointments, we die and rise with the Crucified and Risen Christ.

Today we hear that after witnessing the Ascension, the Apostles gathered in the "upper room" in Jerusalem and "devoted themselves with one accord to prayer." What else can one do when confronted with such an event but praise God and ask for understanding and guidance for what lies ahead? This strategy can also be effective when confronted by the ordinary events of daily life.

• Suffering is redemptive. Identify your sorrows and sufferings. Know they are tied into the suffering, death, and resurrecton of the Lord.
