Scripture Reflection

The reality of Jesus's life in God, shared with believers through his Death and Resurrection. appears in the First Reading. Here we see Christ continuing to work in the world through his disciples. Filled with the Spirit, Philip performs works of physical and spiritual healing that reveal the God and Father of Jesus. In the Second Reading divine presence remains at the side of Christians suffering subtle or overt persecution for their faith. They are encouraged by these words, "always be ready to give an explanation for your hope."

It is hope that should shape the Gospel message, for this is the core of evangelization in both the first and the 21st century. Hope is inherent in Jesus' message of triumph over sin and death and also in the outworking of the Holy Spirit in our midst. The Gospel must be preached and evangelization must be shaped anew in every age by the Holy Spirit. Because the questions and concerns, the history and the education differ from age to age, the Gospel must be inculturated and must respond to the situations and realities in which people live. In the history of the Church, there was no golden age when everyone responded to the Gospel with openness and warmth, when all Catholics were able to give an explanation of their hope, when sin was absent from our midst, and everyone was always obedient.


Passing on the Gospel takes hard work by flawed human beings. The Church does, however, have an advantage in its mission: Jesus promised us the Advocate or Holy Spirit, to comfort us and guide us into all truth. Jesus warned that not everyone will believe the truth when we witness to the faith, but he did promise that he will always guide us into the truth. It is this truth we must offer with gentleness, reverence, and love.

Sacred Lituray

The blessing of baptismal water was changed at the Second Vatican Council from a practice that had been in force since the Middle Ages. It had been the custom to preserve the Easter water blessed on Holy Saturday in the baptismal font for Baptisms during the whole year. The Council provided a new possibility of blessing the water of the font in a shorter prayer during the celebration of Baptism outside of Easter Time. Of course, all water at Baptisms during the fifty days of Easter and water used for the sprinkling rite at Mass during the fifty days of Easter, would come from the baptismal font where the water was blessed at
