Scripture Reflection

In Acts, Peter calls his hearers to believe in Christ, be baptized, and repent. To change their lives so radically would mean turning away from the "corrupt generation" of the surrounding society. Similarly, the second reading encourages Christians whose manner of life so differed from the prevailing culture that they often suffered social alienation. Both authors knew well contemporary Roman culture, in which abortion and infanticide were commonly accepted, powerful men boasted of sexual licentiousness. and violence lurked as a daily condition of most people's lives.


In the midst of such a world, Jesus's disciples were called to follow the example of a Good Shepherd who would lay down his life for his sheep. Despite the portrayal of much religious art, sheep are generally dirty, smelly, stupid, stubborn, and wayward. Without a shepherd they wander off, defenseless and unable to find food or water. For such reasons, Palestinian shepherds gathered their sheep into pens at night, sometimes sleeping in the opening of the pen as a "gate" protecting them from predators and thieves.

We are the sheep and the Risen Lord is our shepherd. He calls us by name and laid down his life to save us. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, continues to watch over us and keep us safe from sin. Sheep follow their shepherd. Good sheep trust their shepherd. We follow where the Lord leads us. Sometimes this is easy, and sometimes this is difficult and challenging. Listen closely and hear the Good Shepherd call you by name.
