#### Scripture Reflection

The geographical references in today's readings from Isaiah and Matthew were highly significant. The land of Zebulun and Naphtali were the territories of the northern-most tribes of Israel. In 721 BC, the Assyrians invaded these regions and destroyed the northern kingdom of Israel. Later, in 587 BC, the Babylonians destroyed the southern kingdom of Judah, sending the population into exile. Matthew uses these geographical allusions deliberately to teach that Jesus' public ministry inaugurates the restoration of God's Kingdom where it was first extinguished. Jesus brings God's light and salvation into these areas of desolation, fulfilling the prophet Isaiah's hope: "The people who walk in darkness / have seen a great light; /upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom/a light has shone."

Jesus enters Galilee with the challenge: "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." Unambiguously, Jesus proclaims his intention of inaugurating God's Kingdom. He assures a call to enter a new relationship with God by undergoing a change of heart.

Jesus invites two sets of brothers, Peter and Andrew and James and John, to follow him. His call comes amid their daily occupations. They respond promptly by abandoning their ordinary activities and redirecting their lives to a new way of service to the Lord and the establishment of his kingdom.

Jesus' call comes to each of us in our everyday activities. In Baptism, we are called to recognize that "the kingdom of heaven is at hand." In our daily lives, we experience Jesus' presence and witness that we are his followers.

#### Everyone has been called to follow the Lord. How do you experience Jesus calling in your daily activities?

#### Precious Blood

Because of the seriousness of this flu, Bishop Bartchak has asked that the Precious Blood of the Lord not be offered at Mass temporarily. It is the belief of the Catholic Church that the whole Body of Christ is present under either form of consecrated bread and wine. Also, the exchange of the sign of peace should avoid bodily contact. A reverent nod with eye contact and a smile will be the temporary practice. Reception of Holy Communion on the hand is encouraged; however, reception on the tongue may not be denied. These norms are in effect throughout the winter months or until the flu season is over.

#### Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

Next weekend, February 2, the Church celebrates one of the oldest feasts for which we have a record: The Presentation of the Lord. Forty days after His Birth, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to fulfill two Mosaic laws: to present their (firstborn) son to God and too "purify" Mary after childbirth, along with the appropriate sacrifices. Although, of course, neither Jesus nor Mary needed to participate in these rituals, Mary and Joseph as faithful Jews fulfilled their obligations before their communities.

We have record of the Church commemorating the priest Simeon and prophetess Anna meeting the 40 day old baby Jesus as far back as the 4th century! By the 7th century, this Feast was accepted by Rome and included an outdoor procession by people holding lit candles: Jesus sheds the light of salvation upon all the world. We sometimes refer to this Feast as "Candlemas," from the 10th century German tradition of blessing candles for use throughout the year. This tradition was practiced in Rome by the 12th century.

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord was re-adopted in the Roman calendar in 1969 as a part of the Second Vatican Council. Our celebration of the Feast next week with the blessing of candles and procession with lit candles follows in the footsteps of millions of Catholic Christians throughout many centuries. Simultaneously, we look backwards to the beauty of Christmas-the birth of Jesus Christ, just past; and we look forward to the final redemption of all Christians in His death and resurrection!
