Scripture Reflection

The Eastern Churches celebrate this feast as" The Meeting," a reference to the long-awaited meeting of the Messiah with his people, represented by Simeon and Anna in the Temple.

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is rooted within Old Testament traditions. The Book of Exodus stipulates that every firstborn Israelite male, human or animal. belongs to God. When Pharaoh would not allow the Israelites to leave Egypt and slavery, God saved the people. Consequently, the firstborn now belongs to God: "Consecrate to me every firstborn; whatever opens the womb among the Israelites, whether of human being or beast, belongs to me" (Exodus 13:2). The Israelites carried out this instruction by presenting their firstborn to God in the Temple: their firstborn of their animal was sacrificed to God while their firstborn sons were brought back by substituting animal sacrifices in their place to God.

Mary and Joseph fulfill this law by presenting Jesus in the Temple and making an offering. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, Simeon recognizes Jesus as the Messiah, prophesying that "my eyes have seen your salvation /which you prepared in the sight of all peoples." He stresses that this revelation is for everyone: pagans and Jews alike. Jesus' life will involve rejection and suffering, while his mother will experience tremendous sorrow: "And you yourself a sword will pierce" (Luke 2:35). Simeon is ready to die, while Anna (who is in the account in the longer version of the Gospel reading) will live to spread the good news of the Messiah.

• What is significant about the presence of Simeon and Anna in the Temple when Jesus is presented there?

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

This weekend, February 2, the Church celebrates one of the oldest feasts for which we have a record: The Presentation of the Lord. Forty days after His Birth, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to fulfill two Mosaic laws: to present their (firstborn) son to God and too "purify" Mary after childbirth, along with the appropriate sacrifices. Although, of course, neither Jesus nor Mary needed to participate in these rituals, Mary and Joseph as faithful Jews fulfilled their obligations before their communities.

We have record of the Church commemorating the priest Simeon and prophetess Anna meeting the 40 day old baby Jesus as far back as the 4th century! By the 7th century, this Feast was accepted by Rome and included an outdoor procession by people holding lit candles: Jesus sheds the light of salvation upon all the world. We sometimes refer to this Feast as "Candlemas," from the 10th century German tradition of blessing candles for use throughout the year. This tradition was practiced in Rome by the 12th century.

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord was re-adopted in the Roman calendar in 1969 as a part of the Second Vatican Council. Our celebration of the Feast this week with the blessing of candles and procession with lit candles follows in the footsteps of millions of Catholic Christians throughout many centuries. Simultaneously, we look backwards to the beauty of Christmas-the birth of Jesus Christ, just past; and we look forward to the final redemption of all Christians in His death and resurrection!

St. Blase and the Blessing of Throats

Saint Blase was a bishop in Armenia during the 4th century. According to various accounts he was a physician before he became a bishop. His cult spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.
