Scripture Reflection

Perhaps you have heard the saying "God's ways are not our ways," in response to an unexplainable tragedy or a strange event. It originates in today's reading from Isaiah. The phrase "seek the Lord" is not about going to the Temple, but about seeing God's abundant mercy in the events and world surrounding us, and recognizing that God, though utterly transcendent, desires always to be among us in the most intimate ways.

Biblical passages describe the grape harvest as a time of celebration. A vineyard at harvest bespeaks security, abundance and the expectation of joy. Jesus plays on this in today's Gospel. The vineyard owner, feeling the spirit of the season, shows unexpected generosity to his late-coming workers, giving them a full day's wage. Although many had struggled to keep the faith during times of persecution, others had failed to do so. Now, as the end of time approached, Christ had drawn the lost back and promised them an equal place in the kingdom.

God's ways are not our ways, as Isaiah reminds us. Even among today's Christians, there are many who have struggled to live their faith, and some express resentment toward those who have not, but such emphases resemble the complaint of the labors who bore "the day's burden and the heat." They indeed bear such burdens, but that is not what earned them their reward. The grape harvest is a time of joy. Our labor alongside Christ is its own reward. By contrast, a person who has spent even one hour laboring alongside Christ has received a matchless gift of grace.

In the Gospel, when it comes time to pay the workers, everyone gets the same full day's wage, and some of the workers complain vehemently. Really, who does that sort of thing! Their human understanding of fairness cannot fathom God's radical generosity. Here's one of those times when we should say, "God's ways are not our ways."

ORDER OF **MATRIMONY**

After the Our Father at the Mass celebrating Matrimony, the prayer "Deliver us" is omitted and the couple receives the Nuptial Blessing. The priest, standing and facing the bride and bridegroom, invokes upon them God's blessings. The **CELEBRATING** Nuptial Blessing is never omitted at Mass. There are three different blessings to choose. The engaged couple in planning the celebration of Matrimony is invited to select one of the three Nuptial Blessings. This is an ancient prayer for the newly married bride and bridegroom in the Christian tradition. Order of Celebrating Matrimony, Numbers, 72-73, 206-207, 208-209.
