Scripture Reflection

Today's readings remind us of our shared responsibility in humanity's journey to holiness. In the First Reading, God appoints Ezekiel to be a sentry or lookout for Israel. Ezekiel is told that his destiny depends on the energy he puts into convincing people to change their wicked ways, whether or not they repent. Of course, conversion is only possible if our we are open to hear God's voice.

The term church describes a group of God's people who share a common purpose, history, set of values and sense of family. In teaching his disciples to bring their disputes to such a community, Jesus drew on well-developed traditions of Second Temple Judaism. Examples of these traditions also appear in the Dead Sea Scrolls. Throughout Israel's war-torn history, internal strife threatened national cohesion. Techniques of conflict resolution formed a significant part of Israel's religious inheritance. Those who bound their life to Israel's law knew that ties of affection in the local assembly could sort out nearly any dispute. Among their fellow people of God, aggrieved parties had their best chance of sympathy; among people they trusted, they could be vulnerable and open to correction.

Trust in God's love grounds Jesus' assurance that God grants the request of any two Christians who agree. In the context of divine love, any Christian who joins with another to continue Christ's mission will find a rich supply of grace. God is at work, enabling the church to reconcile the estranged, to restore ties of affection among people and to pray for the realization of God's dreams.

All of today's readings speak of the importance of right relationship and personal responsibility. Saint Catherine of Siena said, "Speak the truth in love." That's how God treats us, even when we turn away from God. Speak from the desire that the other will change, not to destroy them. It requires being caring rather than judgmental--again, like God treats us. Speak in the way that you would want someone to speak to you. Love your neighbor as yourself.


Inquiry

Liturgical Reflection ...

ORDER OF **MATRIMONY**

When celebrating the Sacrament of Matrimony with Mass, the order of the rite is: Liturgy of the Word, the Celebration of Matrimony, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Once the celebration of Matrimony is completed, the preparation of **CELEBRATING** the altar and gifts follows. The rite suggests that the bride and bridegroom may bring the bread and wine to the altar. Other possibilities would be family or friends. The couple can ask their godparents to bring up the gifts. Once all is ready on the altar, Mass proceeds in the usual manner.
