Scripture Reflection

All three Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) contain the confession of Peter that Jesus is the Messiah. But in today's Gospel Matthew makes significant additions. He adds Jeremiah to the list of persons that popular opinion identified with Jesus. "I, like a trusting lamb led to the slaughter, had not realized that they were hatching plots against me" (Jeremiah 12:19). More importantly, Matthew adds reflections concerning Jesus' reaction to Peter's confession, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God". Jesus blesses Simon stressing that flesh and blood had not revealed this knowledge, but the heavenly Father.

This week's Gospel reading is a complicated theological dialogue that requires some explanation. The setting, Caesarea Philippi, was a Greek colony in northern Galilee. Next to the city was a shrine called the Panion, dedicated to the Greek god, Pan. The shrine was popular with the Greco-Roman settlers of Palestine, not least because its surroundings roared with springs and were heavily wooded. The Panion provided a refreshing place to rest for travelers on the busy highway nearby. It is easy to imagine Jesus and his disciples pausing there.

The "Son of Man" referred to in the Gospel was a mighty warrior many believed to be coming soon. The title comes from Daniel 7:13-14, which prophecies a mysterious being who looks 'like a son of a man". Speculation centered on Elijah, but as Peter notes, some suggested other prophets instead. Peter's faith is strong enough to profess, "You are the Christ, the son of the living God!"

Who do you say that Jesus is? Certain questions change lives, depending on our answer: "Do you take this person to be your husband/wife?" "Do you want this job?" "Can you forgive me?" The question Jesus asks today is one that certainly changes lives. Our response is not simply an academic exercise, a matter of knowing the right answer we learned from a book. Our answer must lead to a commitment that is to be lived out each day.

Update and Important Information Parish Project

The past three weeks have seen much progress with the Parish's capital project. The lower parking lot is temporarily available for parking. There will be a final paving in the weeks ahead. The upper parking lot is to be repayed and will receive new lighting. The far end of the lot has been squared to allow for additional parking. A guard rail will be placed on the upper parking lot overlooking the lower parking lot. *There was an accident this week on the upper parking lot. No one was hurt. Repairs are needed with the wrought iron fence and the limestone caps.

Work on the new building is progressing swiftly. We are assured that occupancy on the second floor will be in time for Sunday, September 10, the first day for Religious Education 2017-2018. The top floor continues to progress with offices and classrooms. The stained glass from the convent has been installed in several of the windows. The exterior of the building continues to be completed. The bell tower to hold the 1870 bell (from the original convent) is being finished. Work is to be completed by the end of the month.

The lower floor (off the alley) will remain unfinished for the time being. This will be an activity center named Charity Hall (with an image of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton). Plumbing, electrical, and heating/air-conditioning have been installed. The smaller kitchen and bathrooms are not completed at this time.

Last year parishioners were asked to give suggestions for the name of the new building. It is now time to make a final decision on what the building will be called. The Building Committee reviewed the dozen suggestions and felt these two titles captured those ideas. We are polling the Parish to invite your choice. 
Infant Baptismal Preparation

ORDER OF **MATRIMONY**

Following the blessing and giving of rings, a hymn or canticle of praise may be sung by the whole community. The Celebration of Matrimony concludes with the Universal Prayer. The ritual offers two options. In the absence of the deacon, the couple may create their own intercessions along with the suggested petitions **CELEBRATING** in the rite. Perhaps there are family members or friends who are sick or in the military, or any need that invites prayer could be added to the Universal Prayer. The priest gives the invitation to prayer and prays the closing to the General Intercessions.
