### Scripture Reflection

Two Gospel narratives reveal that Jesus' ministry extended even to Gentiles. One is today's story of the Canaanite woman and the other is the healing of the centurion's slave. The woman in today's story is a pagan. She came from the nation that had produced a number of Israel's enemies and whose deity, Baal, had nearly replaced the Lord's role as national God. Because of her nationality, her narrative departs from the story of the centurion. This is not a pious, high-status foreigner asking for a one-time favor. This is a needy and potentially hostile outsider whose desperate faith inspires her to claim a place, however lowly, in the inheritance of Israel.

The wider implication of the dialogue, then, is that Gentile membership in the community of faith was not a restricted favor to a few elite individuals. It was the common inheritance of all people. Although it took the early church a long time to sort out the details. Matthew establishes that anyone with a tenacious faith in the grace offered through Jesus had a place among the followers of Christ. Even though these questions of inclusion have been long settled for Christians, the woman's perseverance is still ours to emulate. A key Christian inheritance from Israelite faith is that persistent prayer for an impossible goal yields surprising grace. Remaining steadfast in prayer, even in the face of impossibility, reveals a true person of faith.

Our prayer must be equally resolute, remaining open to God's surprising grace. When we receive no answer, we must persevere. When others tell us to stop, we must persevere. As long as we need God's grace and help, even when we cannot imagine how it will come, we must persevere. The resolute faith of one woman delivered a child from evil. The bold, persistent prayer of a church can transform a world.

#### **Update and Important Information Parish Project**

The past three weeks have seen much progress with the Parish's capital project. The lower parking lot is temporarily available for parking. There will be a final paving in the weeks ahead. The prescribed landscaping (city codes) has begun. The upper parking lot is to be repayed and receive now lighting. The far end of the lot has been squared to allow for additional parking. A guard rail will be placed on the upper parking lot overlooking the lower parking lot.

Work on the new building is progressing swiftly. The second floor will be for our Religious Education Program and has been painted and carpeted. We are assured that occupancy will be in time for Sunday, September 10, the first day for religious education 2017-2018. The top floor continues to progress with offices and classrooms. The walls are now being painted; carpeting is to be installed within two weeks. The stained glass from the convent has been installed in several of the windows. The exterior of the building continues to be completed. The bell tower to hold the 1870 bell (from the original convent) is being finished. Work is to be completed by the end of the month.

The lower floor (off the allev) will remain unfinished for the time being. This will be an activity center named Charity Hall (with an image of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton). Plumbing, electrical, and heating/air-conditioning have been installed. The smaller kitchen and bathrooms are not completed at this time.

Last year parishioners were asked to give suggestions for the name of the new building. It is now time to make a final decision on what the building will be called. The Building Committee reviewed the dozen suggestions and felt these two titles captured those ideas. We are polling the Parish to invite your choice. We will begin this devotion monthly; Wednesday, October 4th will be the next day for Eucharistic Adoration.

#### **Infant Baptismal Preparation**



The acclamation of praise accompanying the reception of the Consent is followed by the Blessing and Giving of Rings. The priest or deacon blesses the rings (three options), sprinkling them with baptismal water, and gives them to the **CELEBRATING** bride and bridegroom. The husband then places his wife's ring on her finger, praying the designated prayer. Likewise, the wife places her husband's ring on the ring finger while saying the prayer. These prayers should be audible to all in the assembly gathered for the Sacrament of Matrimony.
