Scripture Reflection

Today's Gospel verses come from another of Jesus' Last Supper discourses---his teaching for the Apostles before his Death and Resurrection, assuring them that the Advocate would come soon. During Easter Time, however, the message is clearly intended for all believers as a teaching for living in this time and with the grace of the Resurrection. We learn that to express our love of the Lord and to enter into the intimacy of the love between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we must follow the Commandments.

Jesus calls for self-sacrifice, as was his own love. He insists that if the disciples truly love him, they will keep his commandments. Though his departure might leave them feeling abandoned, he reassures them that he will return. The real marvel of this passage is found in the description of mutual indwelling. Jesus is in the Father, Jesus is in the disciples and they are in him, both the Spirit and Jesus will remain in the disciples. Jesus asks the Father to give them another Advocate. This Spirit of truth will remain with the disciples as Jesus' abiding presence, thus sealing his promise, "I will not leave you orphans."

"On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you." Throughout his Gospel, John insists on the strong relationship between Jesus' commandments and the Father's presence. Jesus commanded us to do only what he himself learned from his Father: to lay down his life for his friends. He obeyed the Father out of love, that self-sacrificial love meant that the Father was present with Jesus even after death. It was this presence that gave Jesus victory over death, and his presence that Jesus promises any of his disciples who similarly obey the Father's commandment to love.

According to the tradition in the Catholic Church, the spouses are the ministers of Christ's grace in the Sacrament of Marriage. The man and woman mutually confer upon each other the holy sacrament by expressing their consent before the Church. The ordained minister is the official witness of the Church to this nuptial commitment. The spouses make a freely willed, public statement of their commitment to one another in the name of the Lord. The Church gathers at the Sacrament of Marriage to celebrate with the bride and bridegroom as they ground their love on the love of the Bridegroom, Christ, for his Bride, the Church. The newly married man and woman receive sacramental grace to live out their nuptial promises. (Catechism of the
