Scripture Reflection

The joyful news of the Resurrection of Jesus continues to radiate from the readings for today. The experiences of the first believers, the exhortations of the first disciples, and the post-Resurrection Gospel stories provide rich fare for our celebration of the Paschal Mystery.

The doubt of Thomas and his subsequent profession of faith form the spiritual bookends of today's Gospel. We surely have some empathy for Thomas. How could anyone believe that Jesus was now alive? The presence of the risen Christ in the midst of the disciples is part of the mystery of the Resurrection, and we, like Thomas, have become believers through the word of others. Likewise, others are invited to become believers on our words of faith.

Thomas is the hinge that connects the two Resurrection appearances in the Gospel. Absent for the first event, he is the central character of the second. Thomas represents the second generation of Christians who are called to believe on the testimony of others. The faith required of him is, in a way, more demanding than that required of those who actually encountered the risen Lord. Jesus states that Thomas' ultimate faith does not compare with the faith of those who do not enjoy any sensible experience of the Lord. Thomas should be remembered, not because he was absent or because he doubted, but because like us he was called to believe on the word of others.

Everyone since that select group in the beginning has come to believe on the strength of another's word. Perhaps it was a parent or friend or teacher or some religious figure. Perhaps it was a book, a movie, or even a television show. Sometimes the invitation to believe comes out of the blue---a soul-shattering event, an unexpected experience; sometimes, from within---an inner restlessness, a seeking after answers to life's questions. But when the invitation to believe comes, it calls for a leap. It comes down to an act of trust in the word of another, ultimately in the word of God.

Who or what called you to faith in Jesus as your Lord and God? How have you called others to faith?

ANOINTING OF SICK AT EASTER MASS

ORDER OF
CELEBRATING
MATRIMONY

The Roman Catholic celebration of marriage between two Catholic faithful normally takes place during holy Mass, because of the connection of all the sacraments with the dying and rising of Christ. In the Eucharist the memorial of the New Covenant is realized, the New Covenant in which Christ has united himself for ever to the Church, his beloved bride for whom he gave himself up to death. It is therefore fitting that the spouses should seal their consent to each other through uniting their love to the love of Christ. The newly married man and woman also receive Eucharist so that, communicating in the same Body and the same Blood of Christ, they may form one body in Christ (Catechism of the Catholic Church Number 1621).
