Scripture Reflection

Today and for the next two Sundays we will meet three fascinating Gospel characters: the Samaritan woman, the man born blind, and Lazarus. They will show us- -- those of us already baptized and those preparing for Baptism at the Easter Vigil (the elect)---how Jesus is constantly transforming us. All the Scriptures on these days present images of Baptism and conversion.

This Sunday water bookends our readings and our lives of faith. The Israelites grumble in their thirst. Moses cries out to God in exasperation. God gives the people water from a rock. An extraordinary event makes known that the Lord is in their midst. Jesus gives a Samaritan woman more than water by ordinary means--dialogue and presence. The story is not ordinary. Why? Jews considered Samaritans to be less than human. Men did not speak to women in public. But Jesus spoke to this Samaritan woman in a public place. His request, "Give me a drink," put himself in need of her and began a conversation that satisfied her deeper thirsts for God and acceptance.

In his love, Jesus sees things in us that we do not see in ourselves. The woman in today's Gospel has a complicated and tragic past but becomes a wellspring of hope for her village. The church reads her story during Lent, in preparation for the sacraments of initiation at Easter, because it is only as a result of Christ's death and resurrection, in which we share through baptism, that we can have similar encounters today. In every age, Christ's disciples come to him with their own heartbreak and depravity. He lifts us up and sends us out to bear his light to the world.

Although today's story begins with Jesus' thirst, it is the woman who is refreshed. Transformed, she returned to the people she tried to avoid, and shared her experience. And their encounter with him transformed them. They came to know that the Savior, the Lord, was in their midst. She enters the story as a catechumen and becomes an evangelist, bearer of Good News!

Lent is the time to reflect on our baptism. What does it mean to be claimed for Christ?

Beginning this Sunday at the 10:00 AM Mass, the Church will celebrate the three scrutinies with our Elect and Candidates. On the Third Sunday of Lent, March 19, the Gospel will tell the story of the woman at the well; on the Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 26, the Gospel will tell of the man born blind who regained his sight; and on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, April 2, the Gospel will proclaim the story of Lazarus being called from his grave into life. The scrutinies are not only for our Elect and Candidates, but also for us, the fully initiated. We are to look deeply and seriously at our lives these Lenten days and see what needs to be cleansed of sin and what calls us closer to our God. Please enter the next three weeks with open hearts as we prepare to die and rise with Christ after the forty days of Lent. At the conclusion of the First Scrutiny, our Elect and Candidates receive the gift of the Creed from the assembled at Mass. Those preparing for the Easter Sacraments will stand throughout the body of the Cathedral Church to receive the Profession of Faith from those gathered at the 10:00 AM Mass.
